# **NSSP** - "Presence + Perception = Prevention"

**Broken glass** on Pinellas Trail reported to NSSP. Description of the vandals. NSSP issued a **\$150 REWARD** and posted REWARD Flyers at site locations for "Identification and Location: 2 Blond Girls 5'7" age 14, Boys about 14 years, Match Fingerprints, BREAKING GLASS On Trail, TIPS: Ph. 418-0186."

Adjacent this Trail crossing, **Tiger Auto**, in the past had vehicles vandalized and 4 set on fire. The **City** is now responding and meeting on site to finalize cleaning up the city lot and repaying the asphalt.

With notices, and the help of **St. Pete Police**, parking on the grass right of way on 26th Avenue by soccer people has been eliminated.

**NSSP** has scheduled bike and Kobota Cart rides in Walter Fuller Park **as summer approaches**.

**NSSP** continues to ride in the parks, at Azalea Middle School, sidewalk to the Mall, Pinellas Trail, and neighborhoods – reporting street lights for repair, potholes, foliage to trim, signs to straighten and to replace, etc.

**NEW NSSP shirts** from St. Pete Police, via forfeiture grant, have been made and distributed.

**State DOT** is PAINTING the steel girders beneath **Tyrone Overpass**.

Thanks to **Rep. Kathleen Peters** in response to **NSSP**, **LIGHTS** beneath **Tyrone Overpass** are becoming a reality. **John Kruszona**, DUKE-Energy: **Art Hushen**, President, National Institute of Crime Prevention; **Susan Ajoc**, Community Services Director, **Deborah Larson**, **Community Services**, met with **Dr. Ed** to develop the Lighting Plan beneath Tyrone Overpass.

New Codes Director Todd Yost, spurred on by Dr. Ed and Monica Abbott, finally, after a year, got Liberty Tax and Insurance under control from blowup statue, electronic sign trailer parked on right of way, and human sign impinging on street. Defiant responses of Liberty Tax: "We pay the fines as cost of doing business, but will not stop the illegal use of signs." Eye World across the street at Crossroads Shopping Center developed the same attitude, putting an electronic sign trailer on the right of way. Sign company was notified that NO trailer signs are allowed in St. Pete and trailer signs would be confiscated. With the cooperation of both property management companies, neighborhoods and determined Codes Department, this plague was cured.

# People and Pets in Our Park

"Visit Florida" 2013 tourism had another record-breaking year with 94.7 million visitors.

This increase is 3.5 percent from 2012 and 9.3 percent from 2011, both previous record highs. Three consecutive years of record-breaking tourism brought more money into our state and helped more Floridians get back to work.

Every 85 visitors to Florida creates one new job in our state. The number of direct travel-related jobs reached a record high in 2013, with 1.08 million Floridians employed in the tourism industry, up 2.9 percent from 2012.



Florida's crime rate dropped an impressive 5.2 percent in the first six months of 2013. This significant decrease in crime puts Florida on the path to achieving a 43-year low. According to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's 2013 Semi-Annual Uniform Crime Report, the number of violent crimes was down overall by 3.5 percent, including a significant 10.6-percent drop in murders. Notably, the number of murders with a firearm showed the largest decrease and the number of non-violent crimes dropped by 5.5 percent overall. This decrease in crime is a direct product of the hard work of our law enforcement. Florida continues to become a safer place to live, work and visit.

The Florida House continued our commitment to passing legislation that keeps Florida's highways and roads safe by making it illegal to text while driving. With this law in place, parents are now able to explain to their children that texting while driving is not only dangerous, but also against the law.

The Florida House showed our commitment to strong self-defense laws by voting in a bipartisan fashion to keep the Stand Your Ground law intact. Since the passage of the Stand Your Ground law, the murder rate has gone down. While there are many reasons this might be the case, having robust self-defense laws has had a positive impact. As elected officials, one of our top priorities is to ensure the safety of Florida's families. Our state is a safer place because of strong self-defense laws like Stand Your Ground.


