JTCA "Adopts" Mile 9 of Pinellas Trail

JTCA completed all organizational requirements and held our first cleanup in August with Teams for 4 specific segments. Each Team was complete in 2 hours. **Keep Pinellas Beautiful** report:

July Cleanup: 10 Volunteers, 59 hours, 153 pounds of trash, 1,274 pieces of trash.

One mile of the Pinellas Trail and the LARGE Stonehenge Park beneath Tyrone overpass.

July: \$750 ArborAge Tree Service remove trees, trim trees, 3 locations.

July Planting: 14 Flowering bushes, \$105, 30 bags bark chip mulch \$68.40. Great THANKS to **John and Mary Sweeny, Jeremy Meredith, and Dr. Ed.** At Azalea Middle School, 22nd Ave side, old library sign, the rusty lights and bar covers and concrete blocks were sprayed green, two Jatropha planted beneath the sign, then mulched with 15 bags of bark chips.

August Cleanup: \$118.18 invested in flowering bushes and mulch for the TRAIL. Enhancement of the Trail is the next phase beyond maintenance. JTCA added 3 flowering bushes to the 12 already planted. Totally

cleaned up all biomass at the 32nd Ave N entrance to the Trail, planted bushes and placed bark chips there and at Stonehenge Park Garden which had been cleared of all weeds earlier. 75 hours (19 days on Trail) Pieces removed 1,365 biomass, 520 trash, 26 bags, 388 pounds biomass, 80 pounds trash.

Future Cleanups: Last Saturday of EVEN months, at 8:30am. October 26. December 28.

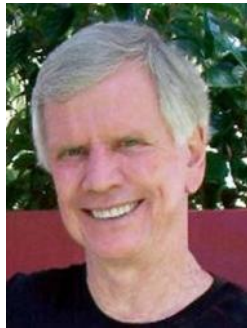

payment. Since many of these stolen cars are used in other crimes, preventive initiatives reducing these thefts will reduce a wide-range of criminal activity.

D.R.O.P. will initially focus on the prevention of auto thefts, which have been trending upward in recent months. A number of these cases involved keys left in the ignition with the car running. Suspects lay in wait outside gas stations or strip malls to jump in and drive off in vehicles left running by the victim, who went into a store for a quick purchase or gas

D.R.O.P.'s focus on auto thefts is one example. They have city-wide responsibility in addressing emerging crime trends, via a proactive, outreach-oriented response, and are instrumental in the application of the newest tools and crime responses in policing, to effectuate positive results. This unit is another example the St. Pete Police Department creating a safer community, by positioning itself at the forefront of progressive, participatory, and responsive policing initiatives. +++

Our year is off to a fantastic start. We have a strong and dedicated staff and we have banded together to develop a high structure, high support learning environment for our students. FLOOD INSURANCE REFORM MAY AFFECT YOU

From Mayor Foster: The impending flood insurance rate changes is very complex legislation with potentially disastrous consequences, requiring raising premiums to reflect true flood risk, make the program financially stable, and change how Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) updates impact policyholders. The changes mean rate increases for some, but not all, policyholders over time.

Approximately 15,000 of our 70,000 single family homes in St. Pete are affected, and may see significant increases in premiums unless something is done. These are homes throughout St. Petersburg, not only homes located directly on the water.

Premium increases are having a chilling effect on the real estate market countywide. Some property sales are not closing. And some who recently purchased a home, figuring on an annual flood insurance premium of a few hundred dollars, are now receiving new premium notices raising their annual cost to thousands of dollars. It is just not in their budget, and could cause round two of the mortgage foreclosure crisis.



So what are we doing?

I have been in constant communication with Congressman Young's office, and have corresponded with U.S. Representatives Gus Bilirakis and Kathy Castor and U.S. Senators Bill Nelson and Marco Rubio. I participated in telephone conferences on the outcome of a hearing by the Senate Subcommittee on Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs. The ongoing devastation in Colorado is evidence that natural disasters, including floods, aren't limited by geography. We must unite as a nation to find an equitable and affordable solution that isn't overwhelmed by its unintended consequences.

The good news is that subcommittees in both the U.S. House and Senate have taken action to delay implementation of the bill, and it looks like that will happen. But that doesn't fix the problem - it only moves it down the road.

Our ultimate goal is reform or repeal of the law. To that end, I have created a **Flood Insurance Reform Task Force** that includes State Senator Jeff Brandes, Pinellas

County Administrator Bob LaSala, City Administrator Tish Elston and other city and county staff involved in housing, public works and economic development. We will rely on Pinellas County Property Appraiser Pam Dubov to provide the data needed to plead our case to Congress. With 33,000 homes impacted in Pinellas County, of which 15,000 are in St. Petersburg, we are at ground zero. We must be at the table when it comes to reform or repeal of this legislation. We will work with our friends in Washington to ensure we are at the forefront of the discussion.

What should you do now?

First, determine if the law impacts you. Contact your flood insurance provider. If you are currently not required to carry flood insurance, chances are you will not be affected by this legislation.

Second, if you have flood insurance, **DO NOT LET YOUR POLICY LAPSE**, even if paid as part of your mortgage. Lapsed policies, even when exempted in some other way, are subject to full increases at the time of reinstatement.

Third, come to us for assistance. Rate increases are based on your home's Base Flood Elevation. Elevation Certificates for approximately 3,800 St. Petersburg properties are available online at www.stpete.org/development/construction_services/elevation_certificates.asp. If you can't find yours, there is a kiosk available in the Construction Services and Permitting lobby at the Municipal Services Center at One Fourth Street North. Our staff is be happy to assist you in your search.

Finally, contact your federal legislators to share your concerns.

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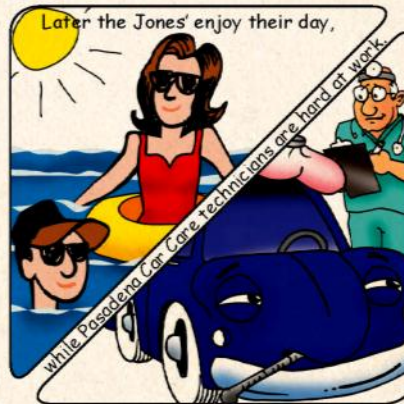
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Taking a Swipe at Snipe Signs

Increasing complaints come from the neighborhoods about pesky "snipe signs" tacked to utility poles or staked in the ground. They advertise yard sales, home repair services, homes for sale or other services or products. Snipe Signs are illegal. The City's new initiative steps up removal of the signs to help beautify neighborhoods and thoroughfares.

All city employees who work in the field are joining in the effort to remove illegal signs. Employees from many divisions, including Parks and Recreation,



Community Services, Water Resources, Stormwater, Codes, and other departments are trained to look for and remove illegal snipe signs.

The program is patterned after "City Watch" program where all city employees are trained and encouraged to report suspicious behavior to the Police to lend more eyes and ears to diminish crime in the city.

Crews concentrate on illegal snipe signs placed in public rights-of-way, medians, and on utility poles. Signs are collected, disposed of at a city Brush Site, and violators fined. Snipe signs DO NOT INCLUDE political or free speech signs.

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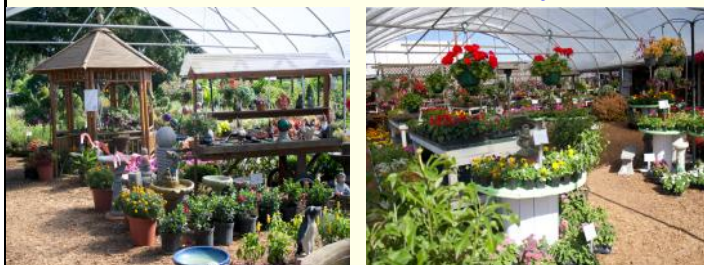
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Hello Neighbor,

Is flood insurance a burning question for you? On October 1, 2013 the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012 (BW-12) became law. The BW-12 legislation requires the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to change the way they run the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Many of the required changes are designed to increase the financial stability of NFIP and ensure that flood insurance rates more accurately reflect the real risk of flooding.

Significant Changes:

- Raising Policy Rates
- Phasing out subsidized flood insurance rates for some policies, over time.

How will the BW-12 affect you?

- After the sale of your home, subsidized rates can no longer be passed on to the new owner. A financed buyer may be impacted on their buying power based on the flood insurance rate.
- If your policy lapses, you will automatically fall into the full risk rate.

What should you do now?

- Review the Flood Insurance Tool Kit for more details about the BW-12. (e-mail for a Tool Kit)
- Contact your Insurance Agent to discuss further.
- Order a flood elevation certificate so we are prepared to answer buyer questions regarding same (3 companies are listed on page 39 of the Tool Kit).

Your insurance agent is your expert; however, I am here to assist in anyway. Don't hesitate to contact me if you wish to discuss further.
