Minutes of the March 21, 2005 Monthly Membership Meeting

- The membership meeting on Monday March 21, 2005 was called to order by President **Tom Killian** at 7:00P.M. 31 were present, 1 new family joined the Association. After the pledge to our flag, Tom read the minutes of the February meeting, approved as read.
- St. Petersburg Police Chief **Chuck Harmon** was our featured speaker. In attendance from the police department were Major **Tom Carey**, Sgt. **Randy Morton**, **Bill Proffitt** Police Community Relations and our CPO Rich Hladik. The Chief spoke for 52 minutes and answered questions from the membership. The Chief reported that 43,000 traffic citations were written in 2004. The year before 42,000 were written. 11,000 arrests were made, 2,400 for drugs.

Response times for categories

- #1 life threatening emergencies 6 minutes,
- #2 domestic and auto accidents 12 minutes,
- #3 stolen plant 18 minutes.

- The police department has a paid staff of 539 positions, which include street officers, detectives and support people. There are three districts with 66 officers assigned to each district; this gives 24 hours a day, 7 days a week protection. There is currently 511 on staff as of last week. The retention of newly trained officers has improved due to pay increases, take home cruisers and a \$14,000 move to St. Petersburg loan. Pocket Bikes and motorized scooters are illegal on the roadways and should be ticketed said the Chief after **Steve Plice** asked the question. The police have a 2 person sub station at the Tyrone Square Mall and work with mall security. Parking in handicapped spaces by non authorized people will be monitored more closely by the police and Mall Security.
- CPO **Rich Hladik** spoke and handed out a sexual predator lists for our members.
- VP **Ron Russell** read the treasurers report in the absence of treasurer **Linda Mouriski**, accepted as read.
- Skip Mitchell** Board Member said that the pool is open March 1 and urged our members to use it.
- Tom Killian** announced that our next meeting is being held at Sunken Gardens. Free guided tour of the gardens with meeting to follow. Monday April 18, Call me to reserve a seat, 343-2041.

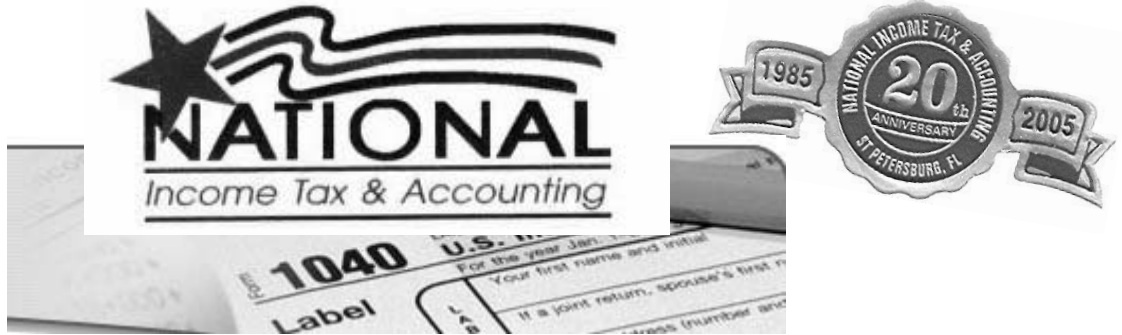

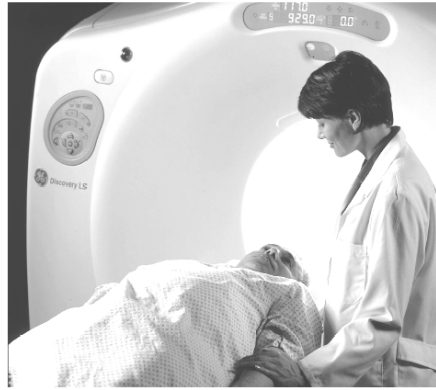

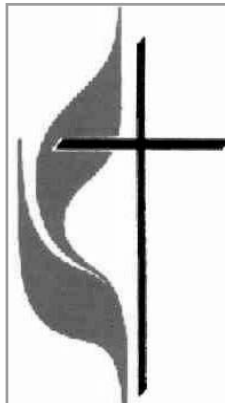

This Months Gardening Tips

CITRUS TREES

There are many varieties of citrus. The genus includes grapefruit (Citrus paradise), small lime (Citrus aurantifolia), lemon (Citrus limon), tangelo, temple, tangerine, murcott honey, blood orange, Satsuma, kumquat and calamondin. In addition to these there are many species and crosses. For instance, tangelo is a cross between a grapefruit and tangerine. Limequat is a cross between lime and kumquat.

The sweet orange is said to have originated in India and was spread by the Spanish to the new world. It is world wide in cultivation.

The citrus we grow to eat is produced on an evergreen tree. It may shed a few leaves in the spring or when there is an insect or disease problem or after a freeze. However, it is considered to be evergreen, although some of the species (not edible) are deciduous. For instance, Poncirus trifoliata is an understock on which some citrus is budded. It is very cold hardy. Satsuma is generally budded on this understock. Satsumas will grow as far north as Georgia and South Carolina in protected areas.

Understocks influence the quality of citrus fruit. They may make the budded part of the tree (a sweet orange or other type) sweeter, more disease resistance or adaptable to various types of soil.

Here is a list of some citrus and when the fruit will mature:

MATURES: September – November

Parson Brown	large fruit, coarse texture
Hamlin	Small fruit, use for juice
Robinson	Tangerine type, easily peeled,
Navel	Mostly seedless, peel thick, large fruit
Dancy	Principle tangerine variety, easily peeled
Satsuma	Large, loose skinned, hardiest

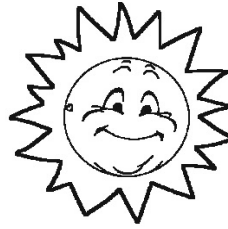
MATURES: December: - February

Pineapple	Juice or eating,
Marsh Grapefruit	Large, seedless
Ruby Red Grapefruit	Red fleshed with blushing
Queen orange	Juice or eating
Temple	many seeds, good eating
Duncan Grapefruit	Seedy, white flesh
Tangelo	Few seeds, good flavor
Murcott Honey	Tangerine type, easily peeled, few Seeds

MATURES: March – July

Valencia orange	good for juice, very few seeds
King orange	large fruit, excellent flavor
Meyer lemon	bears fruit all year
Pondrosa lemon	Very large fruit, seedy
Key lime	very small, greenish pulp, highly acid

INSECTS ON CITRUS

New growth on the young citrus tree, as well as older trees may be subject to aphid damage. Malathion or soapy water will do well.

White flies are small flying insects that lay eggs on the underside of the leaf. The adults do not feed on the leaf but the larvae do. An oil spray will control the white fly larvae. Chewing insects are at a minimum. The orange dog caterpillar, which is the larvae of the giant swallowtail butterfly, is common on young trees. Use thuricide for control or sevin.

FOOT ROT ON CITRUS TREES

One of the advantages of a budded tree (consisting of a scion/rootstock combination) is resistance to diseases. Foot rot, probably named by a podiatrist, may well be the most common soil-borne disease affecting citrus scions, rootstocks and even seedling trees. Actually, you can have root rot, foot rot, and a fruit rot on the same tree, caused by a widely distributed fungus (Phytophthora) that means plant destroyer.

Foot rot lesions usually begin near the bud union, expanding either upward on the trunk or downward into the root crown.

The first symptoms of foot rot are water-soaking of the bark in irregular patches and oozing of varying amounts of gum.

Over time, the diseased bark dries out, settles, cracks and weathers off, with wood beneath the bark attaining brown. Some healing may occur.

If your tree has developed foot rot, scrape off the brown, discolored bark and surface wood until you reach healthy wood and paint the exposed area with a copper paint. Systemic fungicides are also available.

WATERING PLANTS

April is usually a dry month. It becomes necessary to water plants on regular basis. Ideally, the soil should be thoroughly soaked.

BOXELDER BUGS

This gaudy and colorful insect is everywhere. Its body is bright blue, orange-red and black. The abdomen of the nymphs (young) is the outstanding part of the insects. It looks like a glob of orange-red paint moving around on the plant. The only plant I have found this insect a problem on is the golden rain tree.

LEAF MINERS ON TOMATOES

White lines in the leaves of your tomatoes plants can interfere with the growth and functions of the plant. This tiny larvae

We want to remind everyone that it is "business as usual" inside the mall. All the mall concourses are open and there are still lots of open stores between Sears and macy*s. All mall concourses will remain open during the construction period so mall walker and shopper traffic will not be impacted.

The interior barricades have been decorated with Lifestyle Redevelopment graphics and we've even installed "windows" in the barricades to let everyone have a peek at the construction process in action. Three cart displays with renderings have also been set up in the Redevelopment area. In addition, banners will be placed on the construction fencing and large signage will be positioned at key mall roadway entrances to further publicize the upgrades occurring at Tyrone Square. All of the signage will be updated with "Coming Soon" store/restaurant information as the lease deals are finalized.
