Wal-Mart neighbors choke on numbers

- With thousands more cars expected near Tyrone Boulevard at 38th Avenue N, some shun supercenter plans.

ST. PETERSBURG - A county planner has estimated that a proposed Wal-Mart Supercenter on Tyrone Boulevard would add 4,000 to 6,000 cars a day onto roads that are already operating at near capacity.

"You're looking at a pretty substantial increase," said AI Bartolotta, whose department analyzes roads each year.

Traffic along Tyrone Boulevard and Park Street has increased slightly in recent years but remained mostly stable, said county transportation analyst Marc Hanger. That is probably because the area is "built out," or has expanded all it can, Hanger said.

But a 1998 task force with representation from the city, county and state concluded that both intersections of Tyrone Boulevard - at 38th Avenue N and at Park Street - were operat-

Minutes of the March 15, 2004 Monthly Membership Meeting

- President **Tom Killian** called the meeting to order at 7 P.M. 70 people in attendance. After the pledge of allegiance to the flag Tom welcomed our guests and explained our organization.
- **Channel 35** was here tonight taping our meeting.
- Our guest speaker was **Lee Metzger** Administrator of City Services. The city has proposed putting a Skateboard Park where the BMX Track now sits. The BMX is moving to a bigger facility north of here later this year. Lee explained the Skateboard facility at Fossil Park and said that the city would like to add three more parks in the future. The money for the parks would come from the Weeki Wachee building fund and would cost about \$220,000.00 each. There is money in the fund for 10 years of upkeep also. The ramps would be concrete, a 10 foot high green chain link fence would surround the park and would be locked when the park closes. A liability waiver must be signed and a sticker for using the facility must be displayed on the helmet each person must wear. A attendant will check in all skaters and will be on duty at all times that the park is open. A years pass could be purchased by both residents and nonresidents and a punch card for 5 visits would cost \$10.00. **Jennifer Ross** the manager of Fossil Park spoke about the positive results of the Skateboard Park keeping children off the streets and shopping centers. Councilman **Richard Kriseman** answered questions about liability and safety issues. Jungle Terrace VP **Ron Russell** who has visited Fossil Park several times gave a very thorough report on what has happened in the surrounding neighborhood. His recommendations were positive. A motion was made to accept or reject the Skateboard Park proposal for Walter Fuller Park.
- A ballot vote was taken and the motion passed 30 for the proposed Skateboard Park and 9 opposed.
- The minutes of the February meeting were read and approved.
- **Skip Mitchell** Treasurer gave the financial report accepted as read.
- **Officer Rich Hladik** please see his column in the newsletter.
- Councilman **Richard Kriseman** asked the JTCA audience to list their ten top priorities for the coming year. They could be Codes, Police staffing, ect. When constructing the budget he will know what the people in his district want. Send you suggestions to him at P.O. Box 2842 St. Petersburg, FL. 33731-2842. He announced that the pool will be opening early this year on March 22nd.
- Wal-Mart Supercenter discussion. **Ron Rosen** the spokesman for the Colony Mobil Home Park spoke about the renters concerns about the possible sale of the Park. Ron gave traffic figures reflecting what the Supercenter would bring in. A detailed explanation of the meeting events is published in this newsletter. The article was written by **Andrew Meacham of the St. Petersburg Times**. A motion was made by Steve Pllice to oppose the Wal- Mart supercenter due to increased traffic. The vote was 59 opposed to the Wal-Mart Supercenter expansion and 1 in favor.
- **Tom Killian** explained our Easter Egg Hunt on April 10th. and also the Green Thumb Festival on April 24 and 25 and asked for volunteers.
- Meeting adjourned 8:50P.M.
- 3 new members joined our association this evening.

Jungle Terrace Civic Association (1954 - 2004) By: **Tom Killian**

The Jungle Terrace Civic Association was formed in 1954 when a group of neighbors got together with a common interest. Conversion from septic tanks to a city sewer system brought them together. The first meetings were at the residents homes and later moved to a log cabin located on the Bush Complex. Today the meetings are held at the Walter Fuller Youth Center 7891 26th. Avenue North. The annual dues in 1954 were \$2.00, today 50 years later they are \$12.00. Jungle Terrace became the first charter member of (CONA) the Council of Neighborhood Associations. Today there are 110 associations in St. Petersburg.

Jungle Terrace has always been active with CONA. This year Jungle Terrace member Steve Plice is CONA Vice-President and their Newsletter Editor. I am serving this year as the Planning Chairman for the CONA Neighborhood Leadership Program. We send members each year to the Leadership Program to develop them for leadership positions in our Association. Our Association was incorporated in 1990, we have a Nonprofit 501 (c) 3 Tax Exempt status. The Jungle Terrace Neighborhood Plan was approved by the City Council in 2002. Many Jungle Terrace residents put in 4 years of hard work into the plan which will improve Walter Fuller Park and the surrounding area. Major positive changes to Walter Fuller Park will receive funding in 2007 and 2008. The Jungle Terrace borders are 22nd. Avenue North to 40th. Avenue North and 66th. Street west to Boca Ciega Bay. In those borders we have 2,400 homes. We publish a 20 page newsletter 11 months a year and distribute it to 650 homes monthly. We accept advertising to help us with the publishing costs. Jungle Terrace has its own Web-site www.JungleTerrace.org and also has a free chat line. We hold a monthly meeting January through November and we bring in

speakers who inform our residents of current happenings, codes and policing. We are here for the community and work with the Walter Fuller Youth Center, Science Center, Azalea Library, County Schools, Tyrone Industrial Park and many others. We sponsor an Easter Egg Hunt each year for the children also a Pets in the Park and yearly Picnic. We are the Association host for the Green Thumb Festival held each year at Walter Fuller park.

Jungle Terrace has won quality of life battles such as:

- Won 1986 Lawsuit stopping Dormitories for baseball players in Walter Fuller Park.
- Won Lawsuit of Soccer vs. City.
- Won No Probation Office in our Industrial Park.
- Won 2002 Lawsuit of Romano's Macaroni Grill regarding necessary green space landscaping.
- Won 2003 Regional battle before Planning Commission to avoid 3 restaurants taking our Industrial Park land. I am proud to be serving as your President as we celebrate our 50th. Anniversary and urge all of you to get involved and make a positive contribution to our area.

A fresh egg will sink in water, a stale one will float.

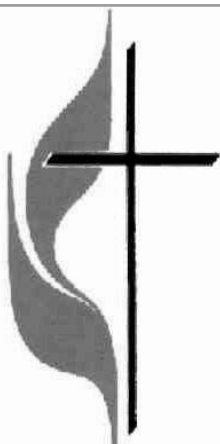
A hen requires 24 to 26 hours to produce an egg. Thirty minutes later, she starts all over again.

Jungle Terrace Civic Association 50th Anniversary by Bob Miller

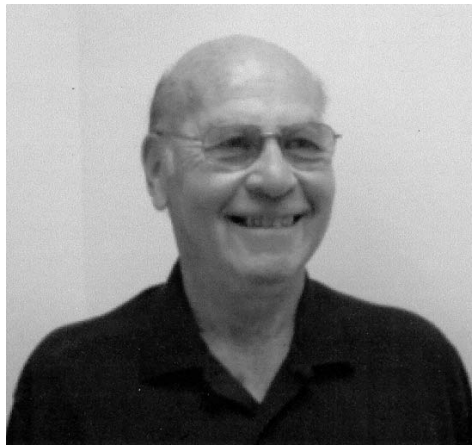

ing at service level F. Bartolotta estimated that a grade of D might be more accurate today, meaning that traffic is moving slowly through.

At Monday's Jungle Terrace Civic Association meeting, residents voted to oppose a larger Wal-Mart at 3993 Tyrone Blvd. Association vice president Steve Plice said that traffic along Park Street and Tyrone Boulevard is already bottlenecked. "If you add more traffic, it's going to be two and three and four light changes before people on Park Street can get through."

City Council member Richard Kriseman, who attended the neighborhood meeting, said his concerns rest with other businesses sharing the shopping center with Wal-Mart and for neighbors of the proposed super-center.

"If I was the developer," Kriseman said, "I would be meeting with Jungle Terrace, Jungle Prada and Seminole to see what I could do to alleviate these concerns about traffic."

The retail giant needs a zoning change and has requested annexation into St Petersburg for the adjacent property now occupied by Colony Mobile Home Park. Wal-Mart spokeswoman Daphne Moore said the store has no timeline on when developers will request a zoning change from residential to commercial use.

Frank Bowman, who runs the Mid-County Connection Center to hear residents' concerns, said the county takes the recommendations of neighborhood associations seriously.

"I think it carries an extreme weight, particularly if we see a pretty consistent opinion coming from neighbors all around," Bowman said.

The Lealman Community Association also opposes the expansion. Seeking to expand its store on Tyrone Boulevard N into a super-center, Wal-Mart has approached owners of Colony

Mobile Home Park about buying their property and turning it into a parking lot. Because the mobile home park at 7001 40th Ave. N is part of the county, Wal-Mart has asked the county to amend the area's annexation planning boundary to allow St Petersburg to annex the land.

The county has delayed a decision on annexation until August.

The mobile home park is owned by 45 residents, who two years ago seized an opportunity to buy the property. About 80 residents passed on the deal. They own their trailers but not the land beneath them.

"Yes, we were offered a chance to buy back then" said Ron Rosen, 67. "And it did not look very good to most of us."

While owners could sell the property to Wal-Mart for \$114,000 - each about four times their investment - the renters have few options if the store expands. Moving to another park can cost \$15,000 or more for homes that are anything but mobile and will then have to be brought up to code.

"You tear down the carport," said Roger Murphy, 72, on what it takes to move a mobile home. "You tear down the roof. You tear down the shed. When you get through, you don't have a mobile home anymore."


The Jungle Terrace vote came immediately after Rosen addressed the group. But most of the residents who spoke talked about increased traffic.

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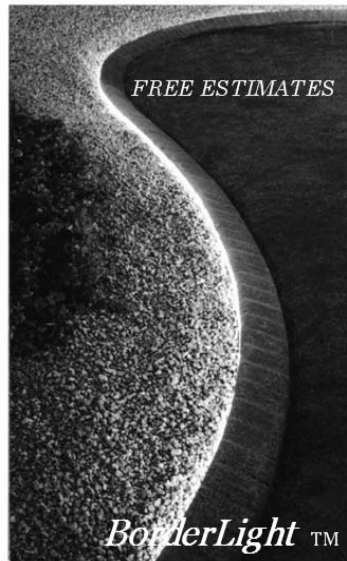
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Street - Sewer Repairs

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According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), millions of homes in the U.S. have smoke detectors that do not work, usually due to dead or missing batteries. Proper installation of your smoke detectors and a quick check each month can mean the difference between safety and a tragedy. Don't delay to check your detectors and make a note on your calendar to check them again each month.

Demand Response Transportation or DART

There is a wonderful service that (PSTA) offers for people who are disabled and are unable to use the accessible (PSTA) buses. I use this service for my aunt who is 96 years old, paraplegic and has had a leg amputated. Wheelchair Transportation has the Dart contract, you probably have seen their vans in St. Petersburg. They are courteous, on time and are good drivers. To qualify for this special transportation you and your doctor have to fill out special forms and then the county considers the application for approval. If you are approved you can use this service to go to doctors, dentists, shopping or a movie. If you cannot travel alone they allow your care giver to ride free. The current cost is \$2.50 each way, round trip \$5.00. If you had to go to the doctors using current transportation rates which are \$25.00 each way and \$1.95 per mile a 20 mile round trip would cost you \$89.00. That same trip using DART would be \$5.00 round trip. Many disabled people avoid going for needed medical checkups because of the high cost of transportation. Officer Rich said that motorized scooters, go peds with motors are illegal. Officers can issue a citation, they usually do so on the second offence. These scooters are not allowed on the sidewalks, roadways or the Pinellas Trail.

Three Easy Steps to Building Great Credit

If you are faced with a small credit history or are recovering from a credit disaster like bankruptcy, building your credit can seem daunting. But it can be done with some simple steps.

First, you should open checking and savings accounts. Lenders use these as indicators that you have a means to pay your bills and are able to put something aside for the future. You will also get more practice in managing your money.

Second, get a copy of your credit report. Credit reports can be ordered for free in some states or for a small fee in others. Once you receive your report, check for errors or omissions, including accounts that don't belong to you, out-of-date information, or misleading information. Any negative information like late payments or judgments against you, should be dropped after seven years. Bankruptcies, however, can stay up to ten years. Once you have a list of corrections to make, report these to the credit bureaus. You can also add positive information to your credit report. If your credit report is missing accounts that you have paid on time, be sure to include that information in your corrections. Your current employer and job title should also be listed.

Third, plan on slowly building your credit by establishing new credit and then using it right. It is generally easier to be granted a department store or gasoline card than a major credit card. You might also consider taking a small personal loan from your bank or credit union. Pay it back on time, without any late payments, and your credit score will most likely improve. Never charge more on a credit card than you can pay each month, and pay every bill on time. Also, don't apply for too many credit cards, or run up the debt on the cards you have. Too much open credit can hurt you, as can using more than 30 percent of the credit you have available to you.

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Great April Fool's Day Hoaxes

In 1957, the BBC reported on a news show that thanks to a very mild winter and the elimination of the spaghetti weevil, Swiss farmers had a bumper spaghetti crop. They showed footage of farm workers pulling strands of dried spaghetti off of trees. Some viewers were so taken in that they called the network, requesting the instructions for growing these amazing spaghetti trees.

In 1996 Taco Bell Corporation announced that it had purchased the Liberty Bell and was renaming it the Taco Liberty Bell. Outraged citizens flooded the National Historic Park in Philadelphia with angry calls until Taco Bell revealed several hours later that it was all a hoax.

National Public Radio staged its own hoax in 1992 when it played several old clips of Richard Nixon declaring a run for the presidency. Saying that he had decided to run once again, NPR stated that his new campaign slogan was, "I didn't do anything wrong, and I won't do it again." It wasn't until the second half of the show that it was announced that it was an April Fool's Day prank.

Burger King published a full page advertisement in 1998 announcing its introduction of the "Left-Handed Whopper," intended for the 32 million left-handed Americans. This innovation was described as having the same ingredients as a regular Whopper, but all the condiments were rotated 180 degrees. A news release went out the next day explaining the prank, but not before several thousands of customers went into restaurants to request the newly designed burgers.


