Minutes of the Jan 19, 2004 Monthly Membership Meeting

- Call to Order
- The meeting began promptly at 7 p.m. with 32 neighbors present. After President, **Tom Killian** lead us in the pledge, the attending officers were introduced. The minutes of the November meeting were read and approved as was the treasurer's report. Our CPO, Officer Hladik could not attend our meeting due to his being assigned to patrol the Martin Luther King festivities.
- There was a Special Presentation given by **Rosie Ray** of the St. Petersburg Mad Dogs. This group was formed as a result of the July, 2002 death of **Mr. Robert Ray**, who was a 54 year old, tri-athlete who suffered a heart attack while swimming at one of the City's pools. They obtain donations and purchase AED (Automated External Defibrillators) to be located at all nine of the City's Pools. Mrs. Ray presented one such devise to **Brad Rice**, the Recreation Supervisor, to be used at the Walter Fuller Pool. It was also suggested and agreed by all that a paramedic give a training session on how to use the unit at a future meeting.

- Our Guest Speaker, **Karl Nurse** who is the President of CONA (Council of Neighborhood Associations). He discussed what roll CONA plays in the City and what their concerns are, which include Safety and the Police Department, Codes and proper enforcement of them, and what he called Bricks and Mortar meaning the infrastructure of the City both what you see and don't see, such as the parks and sewer system respectfully. He encouraged the use of the City's Web site to report code violations and invited interested parties to join the CONA leadership program.

- In the absence of **Ed Carlson**, the chairman of the election committee, **Bob Miller** then read the names of the new board members as follows: President, **Tom Killian**; Vice President, **Ron Russell**; Secretary, **Lyn Dexter**; Treasure, **Skip Mitchell**; and Three Board Members were read as follows: **Linda Mouriski, Mary Scott, & Dave McDonnell**.

At that time, there was a request from the floor that Emily Coeyman be considered for a seat on the board. A vote was taken and the board members elected were: **Linda Moureski, Mary Scott and Emily Coeyman**.

- New/Old Business discussed included **Tom Killian's** announcement of upcoming events such as a Neighborhood Garage Sale to be held on 2/21/04 and Neighborhood Clean up (Residents North of Tyrone to be held on 3/8 and South of Tyrone 3/22) **Skip Mitchell** mentioned the new slide at pool and suggested we all take advantage of the new equipment. **Skip Mitchell** brought forth the fact that last year the JTCA donated \$100 to the Azalea school. In fairness, she suggested a donation this year be given to the 74th Street Elementary (which is also located within the JTCA boundaries). It was explained that the

school is currently under renovations so many portables are located on the school grounds. There is no covered walks to the portables, so if it is raining, the students get wet walking back and forth. A school representative advised that if funds were donated, the money would go towards the purchase of umbrellas for the kids. After a motion was made and seconded, the vote passed to donate \$100 to the 74th Street Elementary.

Azalea Little League, Inc. is a non-profit baseball and softball organization. It serves children 5 to 16 years of age of OUR COMMUNITY. We have a large Challenger Division for children who are physically and/or mentally challenged. They come from our community and many others because we are one of perhaps two Little League's in St. Petersburg that have this program.

Azalea Little League has been at this located in Jungle Terrace since the early 1970's. It was originally char-



tered in 1955 and had many homes before this one was donated. The complex is not owned by the City, nor do we receive ANY help from them. The entire complex is maintained by volunteers. In addition, we also must raise all the monies to support the league ourselves.

We currently are in the 3rd phase of replacing our light poles. It is a very costly endeavor each field costing in excess of \$46,000. We have paid for all but \$15,000 of two fields to date...(We have two more to go.) Our biggest field

will be upwards of \$70,000. We are in desperate need for help. A grant to help us with the lights and fencing would really be a huge help.

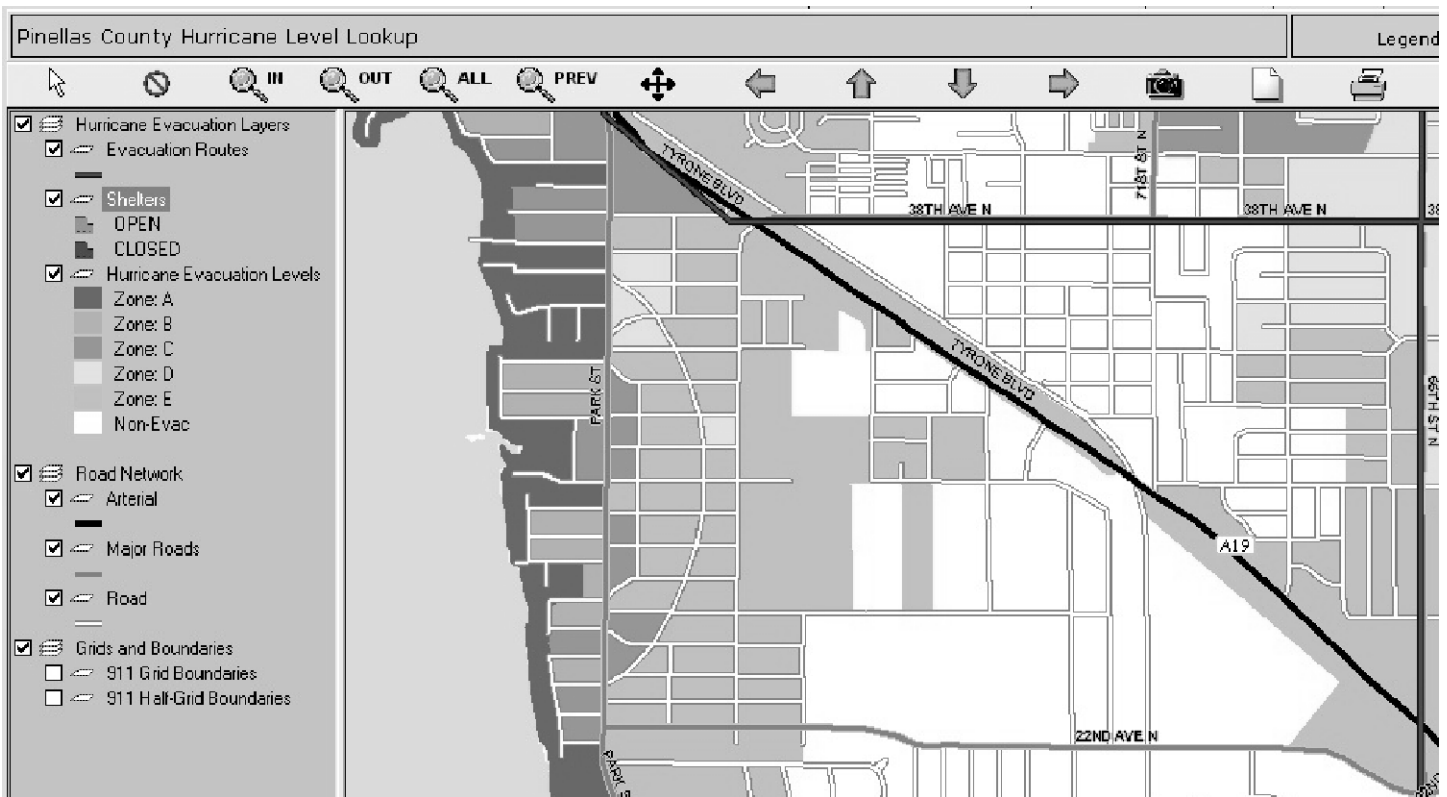

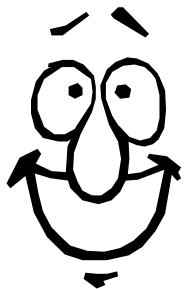

Cream Cheese Braids

- 1 (8 ounce) container of sour cream
- 1/2 cup sugar 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 cap butter or margarine cut into pieces.
- 2 1/4 ounce envelopes of dry active yeast
- 1/2 cup warm water (105*to 115 *)
- 2 large eggs beaten
- 4 cups of all purpose flour
- Cream Cheese filling



Heat first 4 ingredients in a saucepan stirring constantly until butter melts. Cool to 105* to 115*.

Combine yeast and warm water in a large mixing bowl, and let stand 5 minutes. Stir in sour cream mixture and eggs. Gradually add flour (Dough will be soft) cover and chill 8 hours.

Divide dough into 4 portions. Turn out each portion onto a heavily floured surface and knead 4 to 5 times. Roll each portion into a 12 x 8 rectangle and spread with 1/4 of the cream cheese filling leaving a 1 inch border around the edges. Roll up starting at long end press seam side down on lightly greased baking sheet. Cut 6 equal x's across top. Cover and let rise in a warm place until doubled in bulk. Bake at 375* for 15- 20 minutes.

Cream Cheese filling:

- 2 (8 Oz) packages of cream cheese softened
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 large egg
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract

Beat all ingredients at medium speed with electric mixer till smooth.

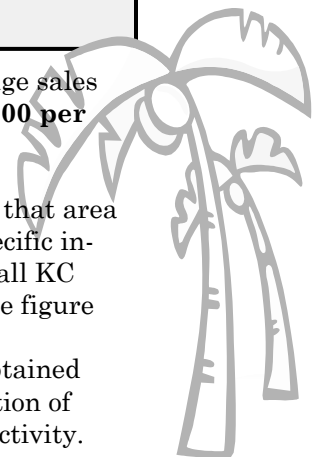

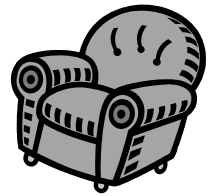

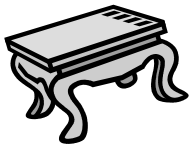
Neighborhood Cleanup Days

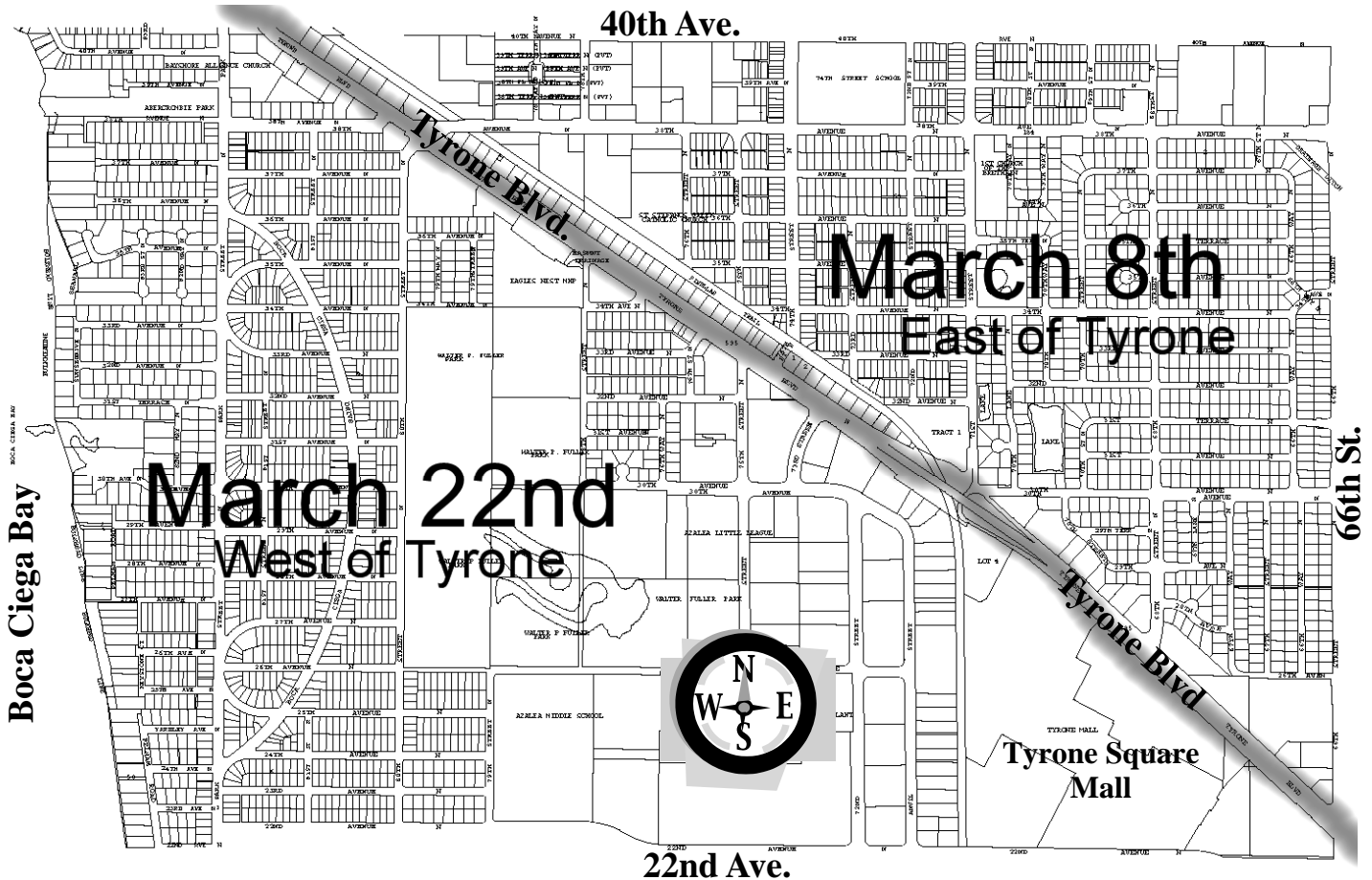

To sweeten up your Valentine's Day, try making these tasty treats to share with your loved ones. And don't forget the card!

Forgotten Kisses

- 2 egg whites, room temperature
- 1/8 teaspoon cream of tartar
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2-3 drops red food coloring
- Hershey's Kisses (6 oz. package, 36 count, unwrapped)



Beat egg whites with cream of tartar and salt in small mixer bowl until soft peaks form. Gradually beat in sugar; continue beating until stiff peaks form. Add vanilla and food coloring. Drop meringue mixture by half teaspoonfuls onto greased cookie sheets; top each with a Hershey's Kiss. Cover kiss completely with a small teaspoonful of meringue. Place in a preheated 375 degree F oven. Immediately turn off oven and let cookies remain in oven overnight or until cookies are completely dry and oven is cold. Don't peek during this time, or your cookies will turn soggy. Makes about 2 1/2 dozen cookies.

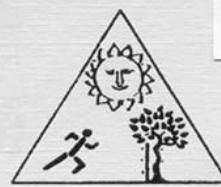

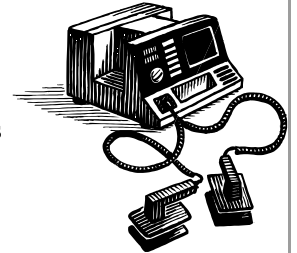

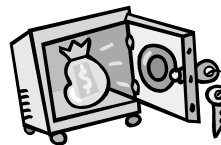

Barbara Spedding, Principal

Barbara Spedding is Principal at 74th St. Elementary School and has been for seven years now. Barbara graduated from Kutztown University in Pennsylvania. She majored in secondary education and went on to teach German and Russian in the junior and senior high school for eight years. She earned her masters degree from the University of Pittsburgh. Barbara moved to Florida with her husband and two sons. While raising her sons and volunteering at their school, she discovered she loved working with elementary students. As a result of this, when Barbara was ready to go back to full-time teaching she chose elementary education.

Barbara is the principal of 74th St. Elementary. There are 670 students enrolled, and as she puts it, "a very talented staff," which consists of 85 teachers and regular employees. The school has two Pre-K special needs classes as well as three varying exceptionality classes. Besides the major academic subjects all students have one class a week in music and art and three in physical education, which makes for a well rounded diverse child.

Due to the hard work of her staff, the school has decreased the number the out of school suspensions. This is being achieved by teaching the children how to manage their behavior and refocusing themselves in order to return to the classroom.



As I walked through the school I could not help but be impressed by the school's atmosphere. Student's framed artwork is displayed throughout the spotlessly clean school. As I left activity was high; classrooms were busy, and the sounds of delighted screams and laughter from children outside in PE class. It is obvious to see that Barbara's experience, time, and love for her students and staff makes for a happy and well seen school.

If you travel on 38th Avenue when school is in session, chances are you have seen Tracy Bowser. Daily rain or shine, she is the Crossing Guard at 74th Street Elementary School. Tracy has been at that post for about five years and loves her job especially the children. This job works well for her also as she has two school age boys so their time off matches.

Tracy teaches the students if her back is to them as she starts across the street they do not come forward till she faces and calls them.

Some of the problems she and the students face are, 1) Speeding – cars not slowing down and drivers not paying attention. 2) Cell Phones – more people talking on the phone and not watching out for the children. 3) Rainy days – cars not keeping enough distance between other cars in case they have to stop suddenly.

Tracy feels a caution light would be helpful before and after school hours to slow traffic, as 38th Avenue is a heavily traveled area.
