





Neighborhood Cleanup Days

February 6th and February 27th are designated Neighborhood Cleanup Days in the Jungle Terrace Neighborhood. The City will provide trucks to pick up those hard to discard items like old furniture, appliances, carpeting, yard waste, limbs (up to 4 feet long), and junk from the garage. This is a free pickup.



The cleanup will proceed as follows. For those residents on the **East** side of Tyrone Blvd, you must put your cleanup items at your curb on February 6th at 7:00 am.

If all the items can't be picked up on February 6th, pickup will continue on the day(s) that follow until completed, but the items must be put at the curb on February 6th at 7:00 am, for this to continue.




For those residents that live **West** of Tyrone Blvd, this process will start on February 27th at 7:00 am.

good spray program must begin at the time of flowering, which is usually in December; there are several fungicides that will control both diseases. Apply neutral copper on a weekly basis at the first appearance of the bloom panicle, continuing until all of the fruit have set. After this, spray monthly until harvest. Use a spreader sicker for a more thorough coverage.

2. The peach tree on our home ground have a gummy substance oozing from the bark. Most of the sticky gum is near the base of the tree, only one or two places occur up on the limbs. Is this a serious problem?

Peach tree are attacked by an insect called the tree borer and in all probability, this is the culprit causing the oozing jelly from your tree. The bores are very difficult to control, I would recommend calling a Professional Pest Control Company.

This Months Gardening Tips

WATER:

This month can be a dry month. Water your lawn at least once a week and give your shrubs a good soaking too. It 's better to soak the lawn/ shrubs once a week, rather than frequent light waterings. For an average lawn, 3/4" to 1" of water/zone is adequate if soil is not bone dry.

RYE GRASS:

It should be fertilized this month; fertilizing also helps your permanent lawn. Bacteria are dormant during the winter months. Use a 16-4-8 in chemical form for best results because organic forms of nitrogen will not be broken down for plant usage by the dormant bacteria.

SHADE TREES:

Most are dormant this month. An excellent time to plant or transplant trees. Golden rain tree, Chinese tallow, sweet gum, red bud, dogwood and some oaks are completely void of leaves. The air is generally cooler than the soil and new roots will be initiated quickly, thus giving the tree a better chance of survival.

GLADIOLUS:

This versatile bulb (corm) can be planted every two weeks for a succession of flowers throughout the spring and early summer months.

BIRD OF PARADISE:

This marvelous plant can bloom throughout the year. The plant does require extra potash to bloom profusely. There are 2 scale insects that attack the leaves of the plant. Malathion will usually take care of the scale if two or more applications are made at fifteen day intervals.

ROSES:

Have lots of roses? Prune now and spray with rose fungicide. **CAMELLIAS:**

A month of heavy bloom and continue depending on the variety for at least a couple of months. Check for tea scale (white growth that develops) on the underside of the leaf. Use Cygon for best control, 2 or 3 application may be necessary. READ DIRECTIONS ON THE BOTTLE.

TREE PRUNING:

Most trees are dormant, it is a good time to remove weak and dead limbs. Oaks with mistletoes, cut the limb where the parasite is growing. **COMPOSTE:**

Recycle Christmas tree. It is better to cut them up and place them in the compost bin. The needles are full of trace elements and high in acid. **VEGETABLES:**

Cabbage, Broccoli, Collards; planted now. Cover in real cold weather. **AZALEAS**

Look out for Leaf Spot fungi (small brown spot) at this time of year. Leaves, not infected with the disease, can be protected by an application of a fungicide like Dithane M-45.

OUESTION & ANSWER

1. Last year our mango produced a lot of fruit. Unfortunately, it was not perfect because it had large black spots all over the fruit. What is our problem and can it be prevented?

Mangos are frequently attacked by one of two diseases—scab or anthracnose. Both diseases can attack all parts of the plant, leaves, flowers and fruit. In order to prevent the problem, a
