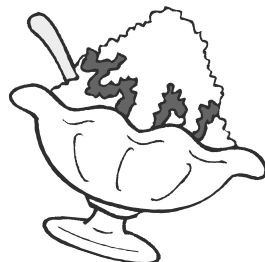

Minutes of the June 20th, 2005 Monthly Membership Meeting

- Our June 20, 2005 meeting of the Jungle Terrace Civic Association was held at the Walter Fuller Center, 7891 26th Avenue North at 7:00 p.m., with 34 people in attendance. After the pledge of allegiance, the secretary's report was read and accepted. The treasurer's report was read, in the absence of the treasurer, and filed for audit.
- President **Tom Killian** introduced our first speaker, **Lita Sargent** of the Tyrone Mall. She spoke regarding the current renovations and passed out a directory. She stated the mall was built in 1972 and outlined its growth over the years and reviewed the improvements to be made in the current project. President Killian thanked Ms. Sargent for her work with the JTCA and for advertising in our newsletter.
- **Maureen Barnes** was introduced as JTCA's new liaison with the city Code Enforcement Department, replacing **Ernie Turner**. She was raised in Azalea area and has been with the city ten years. Her supervisor, Mr. **Mike Vold**, was also introduced. The investigation process was explained in detail, using various scenarios, as well as the compliance time line for resolution if needed. Complaints can be made via telephone (893-7373) or to call Mr. Vold dial 892-5548. The internet may also be utilized to file complaints and you will receive a tracking number enabling you to follow the progress of their investigation. Questions were entertained and literature distributed. President Killian thanked them for their informative presentation.
- CPO **Rich Hladik** brought a sexual predators list showing two in the immediate area who both meet all requirements and there have been no problems. There had been commercial robberies, two via open windows, one at a gas station as well as two residential burglaries. Richards Wholesale Foods had a backdoor pried open and a safe removed. He related there had been two auto thefts and again recommended the use of a "club".
- The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

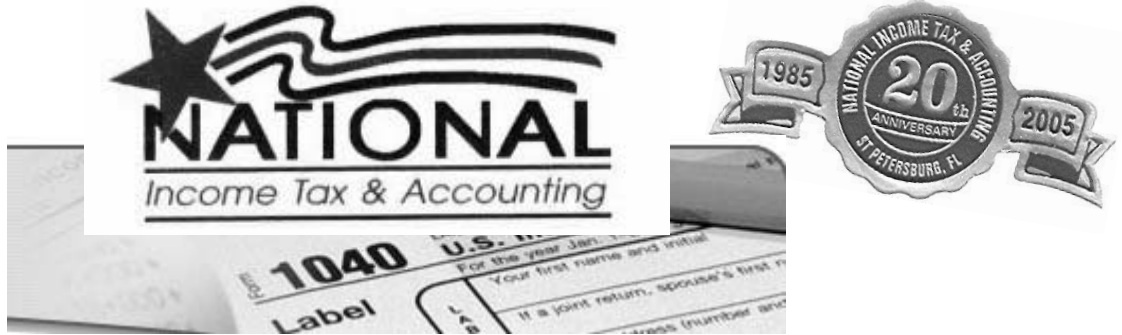

What is Community Policing?

*I think many of us think we have a general understanding of the Community Policing Officer concept. At our March meeting the Chief of Police for the City of St Petersburg, **Chuck Harmon** attended as a speaker. Chief Harmon discussed crime rates in the city. He said he and the city were committed to the "Community Policing Officer" concept. Although I feel I know what that is, I decided to do some research on the subject. I found the following information in the www.StPete.org web site. I hope you find this as informative as I did.*

In the early 1990s, the St. Petersburg Police Department prepared a new mission statement, setting forth an expanded role for the police, working in partnership with the community, to solve community problems.

The St. Petersburg Police Department is committed to establishing and maintaining a meaningful and productive partnership with the community. The goal is to achieve excellence by facilitating a partnership between members and the citizens in order to mutually identify and resolve community problems. This partnership will ultimately enhance the safety and quality of life for the citizens of our community.

Since the early 1990s, many law enforcement departments have experimented with, and even implemented community policing but only on a limited basis focusing only on "high-crime" neighborhoods. The St. Petersburg Police Department embarked on a department-wide community policing philosophy with city-wide deployment. Community policing areas (CPAs) were established city-wide, covering every neighborhood. A community police officer (CPO) was then assigned to

each CPA. Every area of the city continues to have a dedicated CPO. Utilizing the community policing philosophy and its two core components, community partnership and problem solving, they strive to achieve the highest level of quality service and citizen satisfaction. They are also responsible for identifying and resolving quality of life issues in their respective community policing areas. In essence, the CPO is responsible for their CPA 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

The CPO fosters a partnership with the community in order to mutually identify and resolve neighborhood problems and concerns. They identify repeat calls for service and implement problem-solving strategies to resolve them. They review problem-solving progress with coworkers, supervisors and the community. CPOs also develop mutual respect and trust between coworkers and the community. They interact

with residents and merchants, enhance partnerships, and encourage teamwork.

The CPOs work a flexible schedule in order to meet the needs of the community based upon meetings (neighborhood association, crime watch, etc.), events, and problem-solving initiatives. The flexible schedule also facilitates more effective problem solving. You may see the CPO working in uniform and driving a marked police patrol car, patrolling on a police mountain bike, or if the situation calls for it, working in plain clothes. The flexibility of their work schedule, coupled with creative and innovative problem-solving efforts, allows the CPO to resolve problems beyond traditional responses.


Currently, there are 41 community police officers assigned to the community policing areas throughout St. Petersburg. In addition, there are 11 officers assigned to the Downtown Deployment squad, two officers assigned to our largest shopping mall, and two officers assigned to the city's public housing complexes, for a total of 56 community police officers throughout the city. There are six community policing sergeants who report directly to the district majors (unlike the patrol squad sergeants who report to a lieutenant); therefore, streamlining the CPOs chain-of-command.

In addition to a CPO in every neighborhood, there are zone officers (call-driven officers) assigned throughout the city. These zone officers have geographic responsibility for their zone (CPA) during their shift. Squad sergeants and lieutenants have geographic responsibility for their district during their shift. The zone officers work eight-hour shifts, five days a week, providing around-the-clock coverage for the entire city. Their primary duty is to respond to calls for police service. The zone officers are encouraged to partner with the CPO for their assigned area, as well as offer "directed patrols" during uncommitted time. These "directed patrols" are a means for the zone officer to be a part of the problem-solving process, such as providing additional patrols at a problem location or by assisting with a traffic enforcement detail. A "team" is formed consisting of a CPO and at least one zone officer for each of the shifts (days, evenings, and midnights). Furthermore, most of the detectives assigned to the Criminal Investigative Division are also given geographical responsibilities, thus allowing them to become part of the "team" to address emerging crime patterns. ***

WHITE FLIES



White flies are abundant on many plants, especially hibiscus. The adult of this pest is a small, snow white, gnat like insect about one sixteenth of an inch long. There are three peak broods of these adults each year. They usually occur in March-April, June-July and September-October. People usually are concerned when they see the adult Whiteflies. However, these insects as adults

do not feed on or damage plants. It is best to wait three weeks after seeing adults to start treatments, so to get the young or larva that have hatched. The young do the damage by inserting their beak into the leaf and feeding on the sap in the leaf. Orthene and bifenthen are two materials for control. You must spray on the underside of the leaf for best results. You control the young, not adults.

CREPE MYRTLES

If your crepe myrtles haven't bloomed, you probably had a heavy infection of powdery mildew. Neutral copper is a good fungicide for the control of powdery mildew. Apply on a weekly basis or until control is obtained.

POINSETTIAS

Remember to cut about six to eight inches off the terminal growth of your poinsettias. Add magnesium sulfate to deepen the color. On medium sized plants, use one half to one cup. Don't forget to fertilize after removing the tip growth. Use any good mixed fertilizer such as a 6-6-6.

PALM TREES

Now is the best time of year to set any type of palm. The hot weather and the rain showers will aid the palm in becoming established in a very short period of time. Apply a soluble fertilizer once or twice a week.

CHRYSANTHEMUMS

Check all perennial chrysanthemums for spots on the leaves. This fungus will cause excessive leaf drop if the plants are not sprayed with Daconil or a similar fungicide. Applications of the fungicide should be made at least every two weeks.

FIGS

Figs are ripening now. Cover the plants with light netting to prevent birds from ravaging the fruit. Apply an all organic fertilizer and spray on a biweekly basis with neutral copper to prevent rust on the leaves.

ST. AUGUSTINE GRASS

Chinch bugs are absolutely devouring all forms of St. Augustine grass. Even my St. Augustine had to be sprayed. If the population is exceptionally intense, then repeat the insecticide application in about fifteen days. (FOLLOW LABEL DIRECTIONS)

SOD WEB WORM

Although it is a little early for sod web worms watch the lawn closely. This is a small caterpillar three fourths of an inch long. Its color is greenish, and covered with small, dark, inconspicuous spots. The adults are small, dingy brown moths with a wingspread of about three fourths of an inch. The Sod Webworm feed at night and lies dormant in the grass at or near the soil during the day. They rest in a curved position. Partly chewed grass and the presence of frass "fecal pellets" are signs that this pest is attacking the lawn. Further search will usually find the caterpillar. They are not hard to find.

TYRONE SQUARE REDEVELOPEMENT UPDATE

Our exciting Lifestyle Redevelopment project is in full swing!

All of the interior demolition is completed, much of the exterior demolition has been completed and the rebuilding process is now well underway. The new interior demising (walls defining each of the new 14 merchant/restaurant locations) walls have been installed. Relocation/installation of significant new utility/mechanical services for electric, clean water, sanitary sewer, fire sprinkler, fire alarm system and storm water is either completed or in progress. Several merchants located from Macy's to FYE are having new electrical conduit installed at their interior rear wall/breaker electric panel due to the relocation of their electric service to a new Progress Energy transformer. The roof has been cut and the new steel is erected at the new mall entrance.

Upcoming phases include pouring new concrete pads and footings, installing the new compactor next to Macy's dock area, construction of the new exterior merchant/restaurant storefronts, installation of new exterior lighting and extensive parking lot work involving installation of the new landscape islands/irrigation system. Starting in July, we hope to "turn over" the interior mall concourse stores to the new merchants which means that they are then able to complete the construction of their new stores and start opening as early as September/October.

Because of the extensive parking lot work, the construction fenced area will be expanded toward Sears and extend to Tyrone Boulevard. This means that for the next several weeks, traffic will no longer be able to drive around the construction area in the parking lot between Sears and Macy's. Traffic will be rerouted around the south side of the building or onto Tyrone Boulevard. However, the Sears/north Mall entrance will remain open.

Tyrone Square's "Mall Cinderella Story" of turning the most unexcit-

ing, plainest section of the mall exterior into a "Beautiful Swan" Lifestyle component has garnered tremendous interest from the media, other shopping centers and the community.

What we are doing at Tyrone Square is truly "cutting edge". The unique remerchandising of an existing regional enclosed shopping center by incorporating an exterior-facing, streetscape, pedestrian-friendly, quality shopping/dining experience is usually only seen in an exterior Lifestyle center. We will be the first redevelopment of it's kind in the Tampa Bay area and we believe - will be an example for other existing shopping centers throughout the country to follow. By turning part of the mall inside out, we are truly bringing the "best of both worlds" together - the enclosed shopping center and the Lifestyle center - in order to create a unique and quality shopping/dining experience for our community and Tyrone Square's guests.

Of course, everyone wants to know the names of the five exciting new restaurants and merchants that will be occupying our exterior Lifestyle Redevelopment area. We are anxious to share this information, as well, and anticipate making announcements in the near future. However, in the meantime, we can share information on five of the nine new small shop interior merchants that will be opening:

Regis Hairstylists, the first of the nine new interior mall interior merchants, has reopened in their beautiful new location (just a few stores closer to Sears)

Vitamin World, Claire's Boutiques, a Day Spa and Perfume World will also be part of the nine new mall interior merchants in the redevelopment area opening in early fall.

There is lots of work to be done so that we can be completed by the 2005 Holiday Season. Stay tuned and thank you for sharing in our excitement! ***

Tyrone Industrial Park Identification Monuments

The Jungle Terrace Civic Association is using its 2005 City Partnership Grant to build identification monuments in our Industrial Park. There will be four monuments when the project is completed. The city approved the grant put together by our association and five businesses in the park contributed some monies. The association has agreed to do two hours of cleanup each week over the next two years as part of the matching grant. The monuments are constructed of solid concrete with rebar. It takes ninety bags of concrete, each bag weighs sixty pounds to cast the footer and the body of each monument. The cap or roof is cast separately and cemented on. The cement is hand mixed on the building site. I have been working with Bill Martin the builder in

the construction of our monuments. A 4' long by 4' wide 1' thick concrete pad lined with rebar is poured. Four pieces of vertical rebar extend 4' high. The pad is left for a week to dry. A fiberglass mold 5' high is bolted together over the vertical rebar. The cement is poured into the mold and allowed to dry for one week. This solidly connects the two pieces together and prevents anyone from pushing the monument over. Four fiberglass panels will be installed on each monument to identify the Industrial Park. Three monuments are nearing completion and are located at 22nd. Ave.N and Anvil Street next to Rex Electronics, 26th. Ave. N. and 75 Street N. on the NE corner and 73rd. Street N.

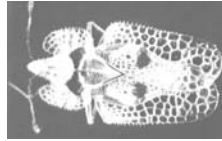
They get their name "webworm" because they leave many webs in areas where they have been working. These webs are easy to see early in the morning when the grass is covered with dew. My experience is they become more active in damaging lawns after rains.

CITRUS TREES

Citrus in particular, will need fertilizer this month. The application applied at this time will help to mature the fruit later in the year. Citrus may also need an application of a pesticide for the control of rust mites. This pest will cause the fruit to turn a rusty brown, if not controlled.

SYCAMORES

Sycamores may become infected with lace bug later in the month. This insect can be controlled with malathion or bifenthren. If your tree is large, you may need a certified pest control company to do the job.



AZALEA



Azaleas and other plants may have an iron deficiency. Try a product called Ironite. It has worked wonders with my plants and lawn too. It is available in a number of garden centers. The material is dry but readily soluble in water.

SWEET POTATOES

Sweet potatoes can be planted. Allow plenty of room for they will spread all over the place.

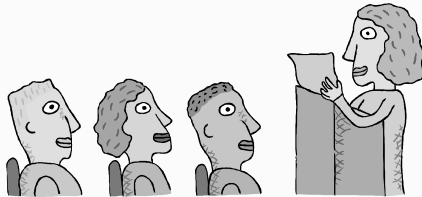
