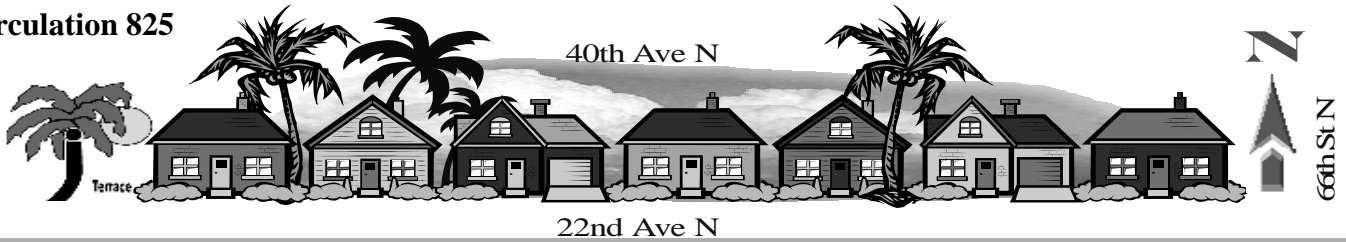

## Minutes of the April 19th, 2004 Monthly Membership Meeting

### Commemorating our 50th Anniversary as an Association! (one of the oldest in the City)

Our President, Tom Killian, called the meeting promptly at 7 p.m. with 56 neighbors in attendance. After the pledge of allegiance to the flag, Mayor Baker read a prodigious proclamation in honor of Jungle Terrace. The Mayor quickly excused himself as he was on the way to Washington D.C. where he was scheduled to accept an award as "Most Livable City" bestowed by the Partners for Livable Communities. In honor of our anniversary there were many other dignitaries in attendance. Deputy Mayor, Mike Dove conveyed his congratulations. Teresa Anderson, the principal of the Azalea Middle School also spoke expressing her appreciation for the partnership their school has experienced with both the neighborhood and local businesses. She advised they are always looking for volunteers and later in the meeting she advised there is a used newspaper collection receptacle located behind the school for which the school receives money from donated papers

Susan Fuchs our Public Service Representative, also congratulated the JTCA for their active participation for 50 years. Susan Ajoc, Director for Neighborhood Partnership also gave a remarkable tribute to the JTCA and was able to identify the past presidents in attendance.

Ingrid Comberg was invited to speak about the Court Watch program and explained briefly their function, in as much as citizens dressed in yellow shirts attend court to show support for the citizen when a Judge makes a sentencing decision. Then Council Member, Richard Kriseman extended his congratulations to our association stating we have been a leader in the City.

Ron Russell was then acknowledged for his Citizens of the Month award from the City for April. The JTCA board members in attendance were then introduced. Special recognition was also extended to Bob Miller for all his efforts to our newsletter and web site. Acknowledged for their attendance were Dave and Donna Hoover from Rivera Bay Association and Len and Liz Hoffman from the Azalea Association (Dave, Donna Liz and Len are also all currently in the CONA leadership program). Our own Linda Mouriski is in the CONA program also.

Under new business Tom Killian presented the minutes from the March meeting which were accepted then Skip Mitchell read the treasure's report which was also accepted. Tom Killian then advised he has applied for a grant to have a monument placed in the Industrial Park linking it as an integral part of our Neighborhood. He then thanked Officer Hladik for his participation in our Easter Egg Hunt and for providing five bicycles with new helmets for our raffle. (For photos of the Easter Egg Hunt, go to our web site.)

Our CPO, Officer Hladik reported on a couple of residence burglaries in the area, some were the result of the home being left unlocked. He urged everyone to lock your doors when you leave your home. He then provided copies of the current child predator list and advised that this weekend there would be a triathlon downtown and many streets would be blocked.

Tom Killian then announced the past presidents in attendance which included, Steve Plice, Ed Carlson and Rich Meredith. He then announced the Green Thumb Festival and requested volunteers to aid with the JTCA booth. Volunteers also requested to assist with Graphic arts for some signs needed. Lyn Dexter announced we have four new members who signed up this evening. Welcome! Tom Killian also announced the Pets in the Park to be held the first Saturday in October and a Neighborhood picnic to be held in November.

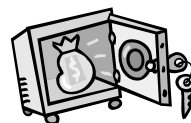
Ron Russell was then invited to speak about the Amber Alert and spoke about the implementation of an Alert being sent to all City Employees who have access to a radio, phone or pager. There has been a staff study done which will report to Council on May 6, 2004. Further, there is a movement to obtain fingerprint machines for use by the City at local events to fingerprint children in case of an abduction.

Richard Kriseman also commented on the rebuilding of the Jungle Prada Pier stating it is currently a budget issue. He urged anyone who feels the funding should be included in the budget should write the Council Members to advise.

Ed Carlson presented photos of bronze statues of kids in the park at play which a Art Grant from the Art Commission will be applied for in the 2007/2008 budget. These statues will be placed in various areas around the perimeter and over looks of the Walter Fuller Park.

Meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.

# The History of Piper-Fuller Airport

According to old maps, the original Piper-Fuller Flying Field was located north of where 22<sup>nd</sup> avenue north is now, extending north to Tyrone Blvd at 30<sup>th</sup> avenue, and west of the Seaboard Rail Road tracks to 78<sup>th</sup> street. The Seaboard Rail Tracks are now the Pinellas trail. The Airport was located next to the north end of the Jungle Golf Course. Two of the holes on the golf course, #10 and #11, were located where 22<sup>nd</sup> avenue north is now, and right in front of the Piper-Fuller Airport at that time. R. L. Piper was from Tyrone, Pennsylvania, a name that applies to sections of our city.

The Jungle Golf Course was located between fifth avenue and 22<sup>nd</sup> avenue north, and ran from Park Street to 74<sup>th</sup> street. The golf course was formally opened on January 1, 1916. The old Club House is now the Farragut Academy. The original club was known as the St. Petersburg Country Club. In 1924, the Allen-Fuller Company purchased the property and renamed it the Jungle Club.

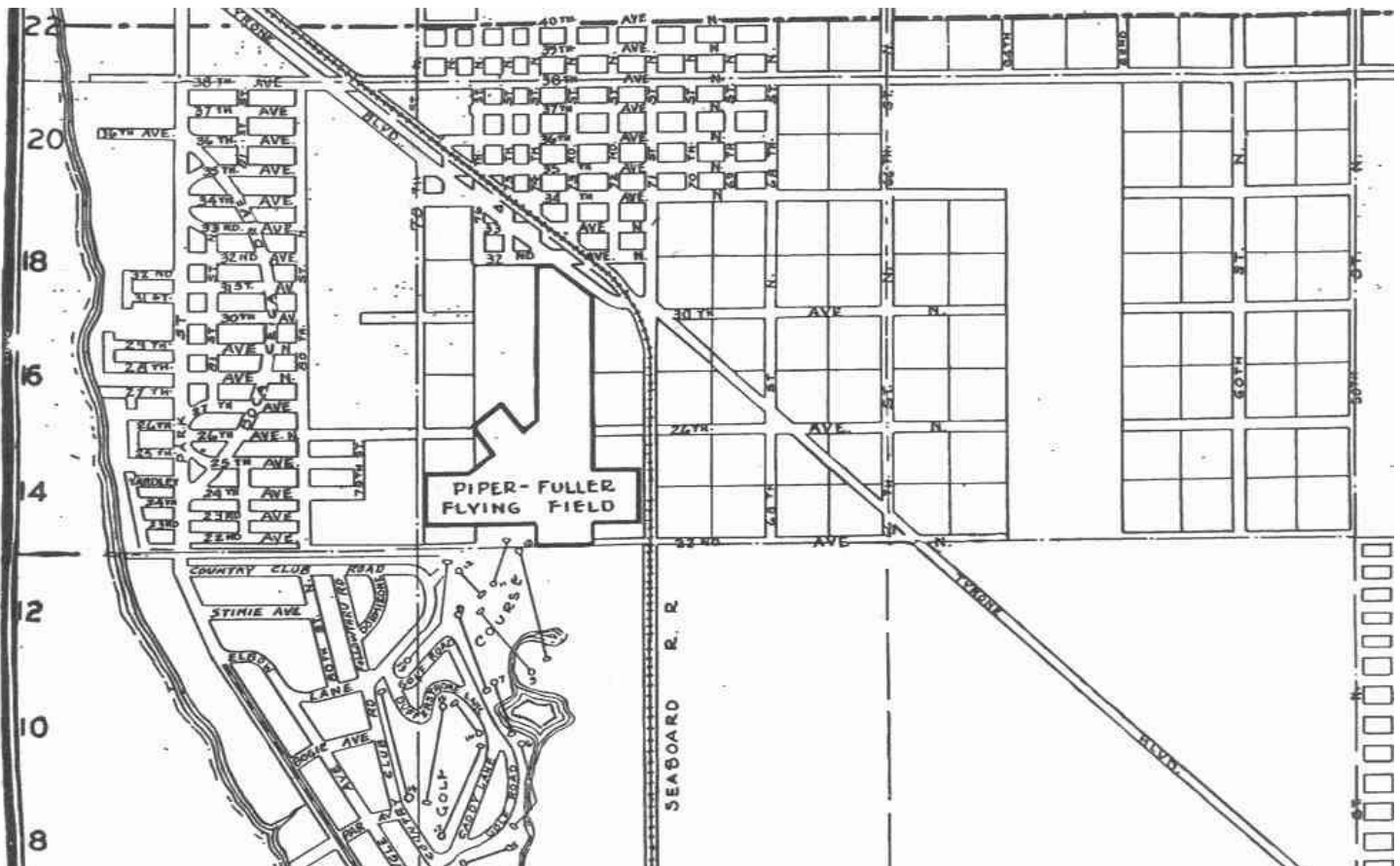
According to the book "Mangroves to Major League," by Mayor Rick Baker, the Piper-Fuller Flying Field was built around 1926 and was the first airfield in St. Petersburg and the third in the state; it was followed by the Grand Central Airport at

Weedon Island in 1929 which was later called Sky Harbor Airport. Albert Whitted Airport also followed in 1929. The book also states that in 1943 about 10,000 Army trainees were camped out at the Piper-Fuller Flying Field and the Jungle Golf Course.

Piper-Fuller airfield was a very colorful airport in its time. It originally consisted of 32 acres. It was the scene of early air meets. Once, General Clair Chenault, and an Air Corps flying team put on an air show there. It is rumored that it was used by bootleggers during the prohibition years. During the war, primary trainers used Piper-Fuller Field.

According to the St. Petersburg Times, on September 23, 1941, the City of St. Petersburg authorized the purchase of the airport and additional land. It was listed as 220 acres; options obtained covered 140 acres for actual landing surfaces, 30 acres for future extension or shops, 10 acres for hangers, 10 acres for parking, and 30 acres north of Tyrone Boulevard for which no use had yet been designated. The cost was \$7,133.14. According to the article filed with the city council, the airport would provide a north-south runway 2,780 feet long and a northeast-south-west runway 3,330 feet. It stated that the entire surface of the field was fairly smooth but needed mowing. Remember that in that time many airports were of a grass surface.

Another article in the St. Petersburg Times, dated December 17,



1941, stated a provision for a major extension of Piper-Fuller airport was made through the city council's authorization to the city manager to purchase an additional 80 acres of property adjoining the recently acquired Field for \$1,000. Negotiations were also underway to purchase an additional 40 acres to provide an east-west runway. According to the maps I have seen these additions to the Field extended it west to 80<sup>th</sup> Street and north to Tyrone Blvd. Thus Walter Fuller Park was part of the old airport.

With the start of World War II, just months after the city purchased the airport, private aviation came to a halt and Albert Whitted Airport was already established with good approaches over water; it had hangers and paved runways. Piper-Fuller was a grass field and could not compete with other more improved airports even though it was used for primary training. World War II started on December 7<sup>th</sup>, 1941, and the Government began to construct airfields to train pilots. Construction of what

we know as the St. Petersburg-Clearwater International Airport, at its present site, started earlier in March 1941, and at that time was named Pinellas Army Airfield. After Pearl Harbor, this airfield was used as a military flight-training base. The 304<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron, a combat training unit of the 337<sup>th</sup> fighter Group (Third Army Air Force), based P-40's and later, P-51's there for the duration of World War II.

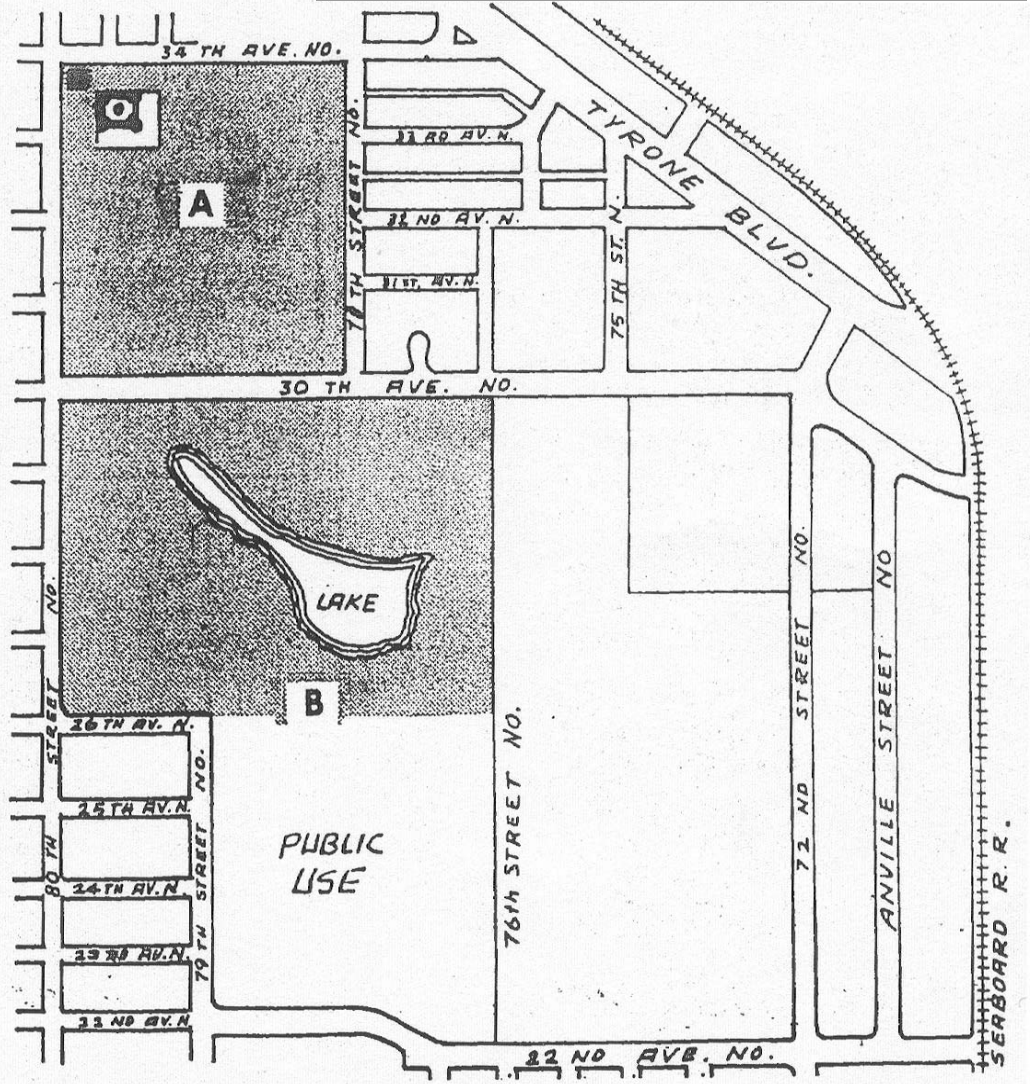
In 1960, with the Piper-Fuller Airport abandoned, the city decided to use most of the old airport property for a park. A contest was run by the Council of Neighborhood Associations and the Times to name the Park. The awards for the contest were to be made May 30<sup>th</sup> at the Jungle Terrace Civic Association Clubhouse, on the northeast corner of 80<sup>th</sup> St. and 33<sup>rd</sup> Ave. North. Yes, we did have a clubhouse at that location along with a ball field and playground. The Jungle Terrace Civic Association was as active then in determining the usage of this valuable land as it is now.

**LEFT.** The map on the left represents our area as it was around 1930. Piper Fuller Flying Field occupies the area that the industrial park is in now. Note the golf course just south of 22nd avenue. Also note the area west of Park Street between 29th and 38th Avenue was not completely developed.

**RIGHT.** This map represents our neighborhood as it looked around 1960. The Jungle Terrace Civic Association Club House was located at the corner of 33rd Avenue and 80th Street. On this map it is in the upper left corner of the area marked "A".

**Scott Taylor Hartzell** hails from New Castle, Pa.

After graduating from New Castle High School and attending Westminster College in New Wilmington, Pa., Hartzell served 12 years in the retail field in the Keystone State. During nearly eight of those years, he held management positions.

About 19 years ago, Hartzell came to St. Petersburg. Prior to receiving a bachelor's degree in journalism from the University of South Florida – St. Petersburg and serving as editor of the university's newspaper, he had already written for several other local small newspapers and established himself as a correspondent with the St. Petersburg Times. It was with the Times that he began chronicling histories of the Sunshine City.

For more than five years, Hartzell's history column has appeared regularly in the Neighborhood Times section of the Times. His stories focus on people, structures, and events that have influenced the area. The stories are peppered with historical facts and comments from locals who have experienced the city's growth. From 2000 to 2001, Hartzell introduced and taught a St. Petersburg history course as part of the elective program at Wellington Central Middle School.

More than three years ago, the St. Petersburg Museum of History asked Hartzell to donate his research to them. The museum now preserves his notes in its archives. He has lectured before numerous organizations, at the main branch of the St. Petersburg Public Library and at Eckerd College. Arcadia Publishing in Charleston, SC, published Hartzell's book, St. Petersburg: An Oral History, in June 2002. It went into its second printing in December 2003.

## Citizen of the Month cares about kids, codes, elders

Much of Ron Russell's passion surrounds the Amber Alert.

ST. PETERSBURG - He's a retired firefighter who now spends his time trying to help find missing children. He's a stickler for code enforcement and reining in lawbreakers. For these acts and others, Ron Russell was named the City Council's Citizen of the Month on Thursday.

Before his current role as vice president of the Jungle Terrace Neighborhood Association, Russell, 59, had represented the neighborhood before several city departments. He joined other residents fighting to keep industrial zoning on the 3200 block of Tyrone Boulevard, where a developer wanted to build three restaurants.

After retiring from a career as a firefighter and arson investigator in Chicago, Russell got certified as a mediator and has taught peer mediation in area high schools. Russell and companion Lyn Dexter also take a beagle, a shepherd mix and a poodle into assisted living facilities as volunteers for Pets Uplifting People.

But much of his passion surrounds the Amber Alert used by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement when a child is missing. Russell has contended that authorities wait too long, often until the evening news, before notifying the public.

"They say she disappeared at 10:35 (a.m.)," Russell said, describing a typical scenario. "I'm sitting here in my office thinking, 'You idiot! Why don't you put it out at 10:35, or 10:36?'"

Russell said his complaint lies not with the FDLE but with the media in promptly airing information about missing children.

Manatee County Sheriff Charlie Wells in February changed that department's policy after the abduction and slaying of 11-year-old Carlie Brucia. In that case, neighboring Sarasota County Sheriff's Office waited a day before issuing an Amber Alert.

Manatee authorities will now alert the media when parents believe their missing children are in danger instead of seeking independent confirmation first.

Russell is campaigning for television stations to go much further. As he watched the testimony of Condoleezza Rice ending, Russell said, "Now is where they could flash an Amber Alert followed by a picture. Or, if that's not available, the information."

Still, the Amber advocate sees reason to hope. "We've come a long way," Russell said.

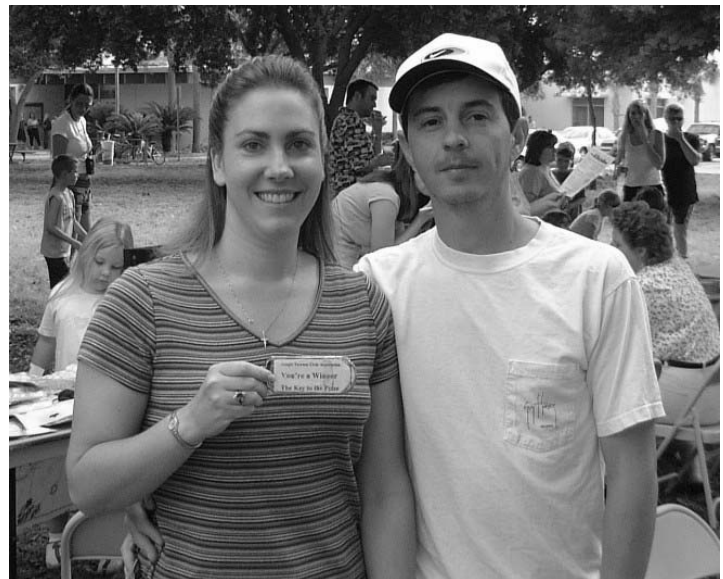

## Sewer Maintenance Update

You may have been one of the local residence who recently received a green notice on your door with information about "Inspection and Rehabilitation of the Sanitary Sewer System". Advanced Underground Imaging from Jacksonville Florida has been contracted by the City of St. Petersburg to perform this work. The first crew to arrive does a pressure cleaning process and wet vac preparation service. The second crew sends a camera (below) into the lines. The truck is equipped with a computer imaging system, this system allows on site viewing by both city personal and the trained professional. The data is recorded and specific information recorded on site. The video and data is recorded on both the computer and a VHS tape. This data is sent to the main office in Jacksonville for final processing and then is provided to the City for review by there engineers, who will make any necessary determination as to repairs if necessary.
