The Anderson family owns the property.

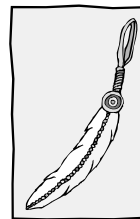
The grounds will be open from 6:15pm to 7:00pm for a self guided tour.

## Diocese Property, 66<sup>th</sup> St. & 9<sup>th</sup> Ave.

I attended a meeting on the land use application for 66<sup>th</sup> St. N. and 9<sup>th</sup> Ave. No., the Diocese property. Mayor Bill Foster and Councilman Herb Polson were there. There has been a positive change in the development plan: the developer is now Mr. William Howell in place of Sembler Group. The development is already in the pipeline and there will be 5 meetings over the next 5 months. May 20 is the second public hearing and vote by City Council.

The main concerns expressed by those in attendance were traffic and the impact upon the neighborhoods, especially near 65<sup>th</sup> Street.

The main part of the complex will consist of an independent living facility of 83 units, and an assisted living facility with an independent component and a skilled nursing facility.

Along 66<sup>th</sup> Street, Baycare will have a medical office building, with a lab, image center and walk-in clinic open only during regular business hours. A child day care center focuses toward the

employees. A 15,000 square foot medical office building will house an elder law attorney, podiatrist, and U.S. Preventative Medicine. There will additionally be a senior workout center, and a branch bank on the corner. It is anticipated 350 jobs will be created.

(There is a nursing facility on 31<sup>st</sup> Street which Mr. Howell is buying as part of this development project – turning that facility into a home for homeless military veterans. That will not impact upon this development.)

In contrast to the commercial development proposed by Sembler, which may have resulted in a large box store, a number of restaurants, one of which included a bar, this project will have much less traffic because of the age and abilities of the occupants.

There will be a retention pond along 66<sup>th</sup> Street with the goal of making the visual entrances look good from 66<sup>th</sup> Street and from 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The extent of traffic modifications is not yet known. The State is involved with any changes to 66<sup>th</sup> St. Concern was expressed that the median at 10<sup>th</sup> and 66<sup>th</sup> not be closed off as that would further restrict ingress and egress for local residents in Crossroads.

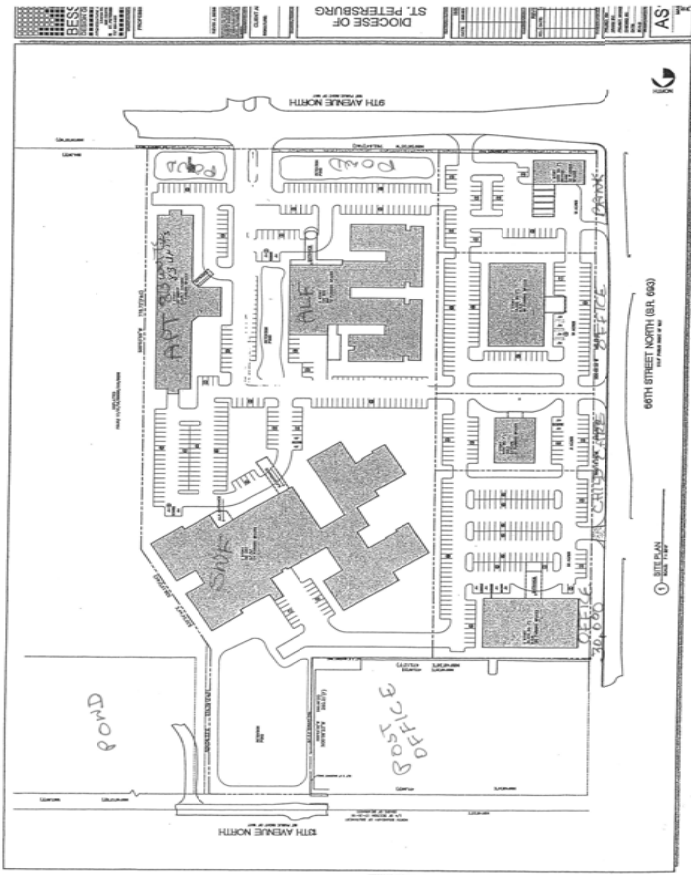

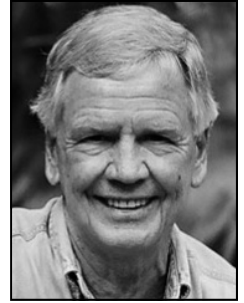


## Walter Fuller Summer Youth Program Donations

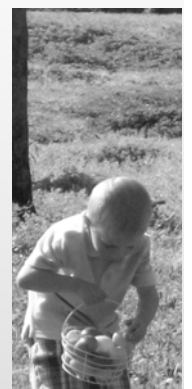

Have you noticed how some things have changed in the last few years? I was born in Baltimore and moved to St. Petersburg a long time ago. In both of these cities and in all the cities that I have visited there was a constant effort to improve the safety of our streets. The main method used was to make our streets as straight and obstacle free as possible. I have always been impressed by the excellent planning of the founders of our city and the way they made our streets straight with few obstacles and a numbering system that makes the finding of locations very easy.

All of this seems to have changed in our city in the last few years. Now to make streets safer, the present "thought pattern" seems to be that it is necessary to put obstacles in the streets to improve safety. We have traffic circles installed in the middle of narrow intersections.



We also install SPEED BUMPS, or they should be called SLOW BUMPS. And if that isn't enough we install planters in the middle of some roads, narrowing the lanes of all sides of the road. **What are they thinking?**

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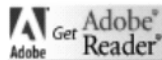
