Minutes of Membership Meeting April 17th, 2006

The meeting started at 7:00 pm.

Minutes for March 2006 meeting were approved. The Treasurer's Report was accepted.

Our CPO, **Rich Hladik**, reported that the Neighborhood was quiet the past month with only one incident in March of four commercial burglaries.

The proposed Porter Development was discussed and several questions were asked and answered to re-cap their presentation at the March 2006 meeting. A vote was held on whether to support this project and it was unanimously approved.

It was announced that, sign-up sheets for those interested in helping out with the various events the association participates, such as helping assembly newsletter, Green Thumb Festival, Pets In the Park & the October Picnic were on the table.

The Green Thumb Festival takes place on April 29 and 30 from 9 am to 4 pm, both days.

Look for the technician who is friendly and willing to explain what his recommendations are and why they are important to you.

Look for someone with experience with your car's make and model. It stands to reason that such a person has the best prospect for resolving any problems you have and giving you confidence in his work. My 25 plus years as an automobile mechanic, a service advisor, and a service manager for dealerships, independent shops, and now as a shop owner, has enabled me to see the auto service industry from every point of view. Although my business is listed as automobile repair and service, I have come to realize I am really in a "people" business. My goal is to have satisfied customers who trust their cars to my care because the work they need is done right.







This Months Gardening Tips

WATERING PLANTS

April is usually a dry month. It becomes necessary to water plants on regular basis. Ideally, the soil should be thoroughly soaked.

BOXELDER BUGS

This gaudy and colorful insect is everywhere. Its body is bright blue, orange-red and black. The abdomen of the nymphs (young) is the outstanding part of the insects. It looks like a glob of orange-red paint moving around on the plant. The only plant I have found this insect a problem on is the golden rain tree.

LEAF MINERS ON TOMATOES

White lines in the leaves of your tomatoes plants can interfere with the growth and functions of the plant. This tiny larvae feeds in-between the upper and lower surface of the leaf, leaving a trail of dead white tissue.


Question:

 $\mathbf{\tilde{M}}$ y crotons are much too tall. When should they be cut back?

Answer:

Get out your pruning shears cutting them back about half their height. This causes the plants to produce more growth at the base and the plant will be fuller, with more color. If you're not in a hurry, why not make some air layers of the better colors?

In air layering, a ring of bark is removed from the branch to be layered, from two cuts spaced from one-half to one inch apart, exposing the wood. The cambium layer, a slight green area immediately underneath the bark, should be completely removed to prevent new bark from forming again rather than roots. Wrap the cut surface with a ball of moist sphagnum moss about as big as a man's fist. This is held in place with a waxed string or rubber band and the entire ball wrapped with plastic film or aluminum foil. The plants will root quickly at the point the cut was made, and after the roots are established, the branch is removed from the parent just below the roots, and planted in a pot or in the garden where it is to grow.
