## Annual Membership Dues Due in January


If you have not renewed your membership in the Jungle Terrace Civic Association, please take a moment to fill out this membership form and bring it to the next meeting or send your dues to the address below.

## **Speed Bumps and Creative Alternatives**

Following our "exciting" speed bumps meeting, the "opposition" and Tom Killian met with the City to develop alternate possibilities to resolve real or perceived issues. We measured street width, discussed with neighbors, and developed alternatives to speed bumps.

A "phased approach" to slow traffic emerged. The first phase consists

- 1. Line an open parking lane next to the park -- hatched walk at gates in fence.
- 2. Center lines striped to define <u>narrow</u> 10 foot driving lanes. Both 1. and 2. deal with "a wide street inviting going fast".
- 3. Parking lane continued as NO PARKING at 30th and 78th tapering around to Devil Rays driveway.
- 4.PARC crosswalk connects ramp onto park sidewalk to driveway where clients cross.
- 5. Center double-line markings begin at crosswalk, funneling westbound traffic to narrow lanes beginning on 30th Avenue at 76 Way.
- 6.All striping: uses slightly raised reflective material, rather than paint. This is a special application by non-City contractors. The work order is in place.
- 7. Radar on a pole for one week.
- 8. Police enforcement for 4 weeks both parking and moving traffic.

We continued to develop future possibilities of landscaped refuge islands on each side of the PARC crosswalk. However, these would interfere with Indianapolis Motorcycle Police performing for PARC people every year on 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue during Festival of States week. There are many other creative, effective, and esthetic approaches to traffic. Speed bumps can become a form of littering, and are a last resort.

Creative thinking neighbors: for errant soccer balls, the City wanted to erect telephone poles and pull up big nets - interfering with remote control airplane flying. Neighbors met and came up with 7+ alternatives. The one selected was both effective and esthetic. There are usually many ways to solve a problem.

The process for traffic calming requires very specific steps. First is "Triple E" approach to review all requests: Enforcement, Education, and Engineering. The Police are first requested to conduct speed enforcement. If needed, Neighborhood Speed Watch Program is installed. ALL traditional engineering solutions are considered. Finally, a followup to see if the concern has been corrected.

Next, if determined necessary, the 2 page process to develop a street traffic plan outlines the very specific steps and requirements. This is located at <a href="http://www.stpete.org/transneigh.htm">http://www.stpete.org/transneigh.htm</a>. The "Neighborhood Transportation Management Program" is also there in the link, Traffic Plans - Funding.

By established protocol, all the above must be accomplished prior to considering speed bumps. \*\*\*

Late note: Actions listed in Ed's article above are pending. A petition will be circulated to get signatures of all involved.







## This Months Gardening Tips

by **Dean Miner**, President Floridian Pest & Turf (see ad at right) November 2005

#### Azalea

keep these plants well watered. The buds will be growing during the cool weather and if water is not supplied, they may abort or be very small for flowering in the spring.

#### Camellias

Tea scale may have reinfested some of your plnts. Use cygon for best results (ALWAYS FOLLOW LABEL DIRECTIONS). Early varieties will certainly have a few flowers now. Water the plants at least once a week by thoroughly soaking the soil.

#### Christmas cactus

This holiday season plant should have a lot of buds by the end of the month. Don't over water. Do not fertilize. Growing the plant a little on the dry side will help to prevent root fungus. Should the plant show signs of collapsing, the leaves, (so called) will limp and detatch from the main stem. This is the first sign of a root rot. It can be controlled, even prevented, by drenching the soil and roots with a good fungicide.

#### **Easter Lilies**

If you didn't get your bulbs in the ground earlier, then do it immediately. Let me suggest you add about two cups of cow manure in the planting hole. Plant the bulbs at least four to six inches deep. Mulch to help conserve moisture. Water on a daily basis. Once the leaves have emerged, fertilize with a soluble fertilizer at least two or three times a week.

#### Plugs for St. Augustine

Frequently, the question is asked about when to plant because this is an easy method of establishing a new lawn. Honestly, plugs can be planted any time of the year. Fall is a very good time. The soil is warmer than the air. As a result, the roots will grow and become established and the plug will be ready to produce new growth in the form of runners in the spring. Consider plugging your existing St. Augustine lawn where areas are thinned due to insects and drought or converting your worm out Bahia lawn to St. Augustine.

#### **Poinsettia**

The hornworms are out in great force!!! Check all outside plants on a daily basis. This worm is very hard to see so, look closely at the plant. Use thuricide for best control. If the plant has yellow color, then add magnesium sulfate (epsom salts), using about a cup or two to a large plant. Add a small amount of good fertilizer at the same time.

#### Roses

Although a fine plant for flowers, they must have constant attention. It is necessary to maintain a weekly spray program. Use a good fungicide for control of black spot and mildew. Don't forget to fertilize every month to six weeks. Insects will be at a minimum, during cool weather. Nevertheless, a few such as aphids or even an occasional worm or spider mite may land on the plant. Water plants at least every other day, soaking the soil thoroughly. \*\*\*
