MOTIVATION: At some point, you may question the value of our association. Near the end of a particularly difficult Monday, you probably doubt the importance of going to the meeting that night. At September's meeting, the reasons for participating in our association became crystal clear to me.

We had a presentation by local developer Les Porter, who has decided to work with the community, without forcing his plans upon us. It would have been simple for him to gain approval from the city, and simply request EDC grant him some variances. Instead, he approached us directly.

This is the end result of many years of activism by past and present association members and officers. They have truly made my duties easier for all of their hard work, and have prompted many developers to change how they work with local communities.

We also heard from some of our neighbors who were asking for our support to install speed bumps in their corner of Jungle Terrace. Knowing this is a sensitive subject for everyone, I decided we should hear their arguments. I wanted to give them a fair opportunity to voice their concerns and possibly even recruit a few new members, if feeling truly passionate about their neighborhood.

I personally contacted approximately 3/4's of the people who had signed the petitions in favor of speed bumps. I matched names to addresses and verified that none of our members lived on the streets that would be affected—believe me, those association members would have gotten a phone call first!

Of the households I called, 2 families attended the meeting. Not one, joined the association. They lost our support by 1 vote. If both families had joined that night, they might have won, for the cost of 2 memberships.

They would have had the support of JTCA and very likely would have gotten the speed bumps. Additionally, we would be closer to curbing crime along 66th St N., by having more members in that area to keep us informed and participating in the association.

Minutes of Membership Meeting Sept ember 18th, 2006

The meeting started at 7:04 pm.

Officer **King**, our CPO, spoke of recent problems in our area the past month. The parking problems around the soccer fields seems to be going away. There were two more suspicious circumstances in our area, at Azalea Foot-



ball and at bus stops, where a man in a truck parks and acts suspicious when there are children present. There were fewer car thefts. Three were because of unlocked cars. **Please remember to lock your vehicles.** Officer King then answered several questions.

Bill Harper from Chabad Jewish Center spoke about how they are interested in the public garden area on 22nd Avenue North to purchase and build a small synagogue. There are no firm plans at this time as they are just trying to see if there would be community support for this project or not. He answered several questions from the members.

It was moved and seconded to table this issue until more information is known. It was unanimously passed.

The issue of speed bumps on various roads in the neighborhood was discussed and it was moved and seconded to vote on all speed bumps at once. It was unanimously passed to do so. A vote was taken and the results were five for the speed bumps and six against them.

Kim Fraser, from TASCO, City of St. Petersburg, discussed the Halloween Event for fundraising for City teens will be held in the lot at the corner of 30th Avenue North and 71st Street. Traffic would be routed on the frontage road from Tyrone Blvd. to underneath the underpass of Tyrone and back onto Tyrone to lessen the impact of traffic in the neighborhood. The event will be October 27 and 28 from 6 pm to 11 pm and October 30 and 31 at the same time. There will not be any loud music or other such things as it is a maze and other activities for the teens to participate in.

Karen Saley, Family and Consumer Sciences Education Instructor from Pinellas County Extension spoke on the importance of reading and understanding labels. She also spoke about the *Steps to A Healthier Florida Grant* - to help all Floridians to eat better by understanding what they are eating. She answered several questions from the audience.

Les Porter, from Porter Development spoke on the status of the project at 66th Street between 13th Avenue North and 18th Avenue North on the west side of 66th Street. The buildings that will be coming down should be demolished by the Christmas Holiday. They are in the process of reworking the condos due to the current market of real estate.

Ed Carlson spoke about the Sembler project on 66th Street North and 9th Avenue North. He discussed the next steps in the process for it to be approved or not.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm.





This Months Gardening Tips

Bananas Are you lucky enough to have these plants in your home grounds? If you do, then the fruit should begin to mature. How do you tell if it is ready to pick? To begin, it takes bananas about three and a half months to mature from time the first hand is formed. The fruit will become very plump, have no sharp edges and take on a whitish green color. It takes some experience to determine maturity. Once in awhile you will have a bunch that will show some light yellow color and then you will know they are ready to harvest.

Caladiums It is not time to plant but to dig, unless you gamble and leave the tubers in the ground. The tubers should be washed, dusted with insecticide, such as Sevin to prevent insect damage during storage. Store in a cool dry place.

Citrus Did you fertilize your citrus last month? If you didn't, then now is the time to apply a good citrus fertilizer. It should contain some trace elements. Use one pound for each foot of tree spread. It may be a good idea to have the pH of the soil checked at this time. If the soil is, too sour (acid), then add dolomite.

Geraniums This magnificent winter plant is available now. If you want a most attractive bed, combine them with some dusty miller. I believe you will have more complements than you ever imagined. Both plants are almost disease and insect free during the fall and winter months.

Magnolia Want to grow your own tree? Seeds are all over the trees and if you pick them up now (they are bright red), remove the pulp by soaking in water for four or five days. Then mix them in a moist potting soil and place in the refrigerator for 90-120 days. Then take them out and plant. In the spring they will germinate and you will have a bunch of young seedlings to grow or give away.





Maple Tree Is your maple showing dead leaves on the tips of the branches? If it is, then you have had "maple tip borer". This is a tiny beetle that infest the tips by boring into the small branch. It could have been prevented by spraying the tree with an insecticide, beginning in June.

Roses This plant requires constant care. Pruning of long limbs, not severely, but enough to shape the plant, may be required. Fertilize with a rose fertilizer, spray for control of diseases and insects. Mildew and black spot are the most common problems. Spider mites, thrips and leaf cutter beetle may plaque some of the plants.

Lawns This is the month to apply a weed and feed to control the weeds in St. Augustine. Watch the temperature and do not apply any weed killer if the temperature is above 85F.
