

Jungle Terrace Civic Association Minutes of Membership Meeting November 19, 2007

The meeting started at 7:00 p.m. There were 21 present.

Community Service Officer McGovern discussed the crime statistics and again there was not much activity in the area other than traffic accidents. Questions were asked

and answered.

Ed Carlson discussed Florida Hometown Democracy and the ballot initiative for the upcoming election.

Dr. Carlson also discussed the BMX and Skate Park. He discussed the City wanting the residents in the area to agree to moving the Skate Park and in return, he proposes the City provide in return decorative lighting around the Park, an alternative curb, green fencing vs black or metal fencing, among other items. General discussion of the members present were more in favor of this than against it. No formal vote was taken.

Lyn Dexter gave the Treasurer's Report for October 2007. It

was moved and seconded to accept the Report. It passed unanimously

Ron Russell spoke on the importance of fire safety and of having working smoke detectors in the correct place. For those in need of smoke detectors, the Fire Department will provide and install them for you. Just call 893-SAFE.

Vice President Ron Russell, Treasurer Lyn Dexter and Secretary Janet Herring, Newsletter Committee Tom Killian and back-up Linda Mourski. There is currently a vacancy for President. Skateboard Facility UPDATE – Letter of Agreement

By a show of hands to indicate their position, JTCA members favored permitting a free-form Skateboard facility in Walter Fuller Park - IN EXCHANGE for a Letter of Agreement from the City that will be made a part of our Neighborhood Plan and Park Plan. A DRAFT of the Letter has been received and is being reviewed. The Letter guarantees completing the decorative lighting around the entire park at a cost of \$167,800; Green vinyl wrapped fences for all fencing; removal of steel gates and restricting access to the park by cars at the two curb cuts from Devil Rays entrance off 80th Street; Continuing to Aerate the area used for Green Thumb Festival and Spring Training parking; Removal of abandoned light pole in park at 76th Way and 30th Ave N; Revised parking for Walter Fuller Center will have have at least the same number of marked parking places as the current parking area and the auxiliary parking areas – additionally overflow parking on the grass will be possible along the two driveways, one in, one out, to the parking area; Code Enforcement regarding Azalea Little League property will be "double teamed to get it corrected." We have also asked them to look at stormwater management by swaling large unused areas on the Azalea Little League property to keep more water in the park – and the City possibly make some improvements for Azalea Little League in return. There are a few refinements required to the draft, and we anticipate the final Letter of Agreement to be ready for a vote in January.

Neighborhood Cleanup Days


February 4th and February 11th, 2008 are designated Neighborhood Cleanup Days in the Jungle Terrace Neighborhood. The City will provide trucks to pick up those hard to discard items like old furniture, appliances, carpeting, yard waste, limbs (up to 4 feet long), and junk from the garage. This is a free pickup.

The cleanup will proceed as follows. For those residents on the East side of Tyrone Blvd, you must put your cleanup items at your curb on February 4th at 7:00 am.

The city will provide trucks to pick up your items. If all the items can't be picked up on February 4th, pickup will continue on the day/s that follow until completed but the items must be put at the curb on February 4th at 7:00 am.

For those residents that live West of Tyrone Blvd, this process will start on February 11th at 7:00 am.

The City's Sanitation Department WILL NOT pick up hazardous wastes (paint, solvents, pesticides, etc), junk cars or



Nautical Tidbit

When boating or just living the casual lifestyle around the Bay, do your sunglasses ever get covered with salt spray?



It's not a good idea to remove the salt deposits with your sleeve or even a handkerchief as you run the risk of scratching your plastic lenses. Here's a better idea. Take some cotton balls and spray them lightly with lens or glass cleaner, then put them in a sealable plastic container (e.g., Tupperware). When your glasses get dirty, pull out a cotton ball, wipe them down and you're good to go. Keep the container in your boat or car, but squeeze out the air before sealing the container so the cotton balls stay moist longer.





Recipe of the Month "Cowboy Caviar"

A spicy bean salsa, this twist on traditional salsa is enlivened with black beans, corn, and black eyed peas. Great for a Super Bowl party. Serve with a corn chip like scoopable Frito's.



INGREDIENTS:

1 (15 oz) can black eyed peas
1 (15 oz) can black beans,
rinsed and drained
1 (15 oz) can whole kernel corn, drained
½ Cup chopped onion
½ Cup chopped green bell pepper
1 (4 oz) can diced jalapeno peppers
1 (14.5 oz) can diced tomatoes, drained
1 Cup Italian style salad dressing
½ tsp. garlic salt

DIRECTIONS:

In a medium bowl, combine black eyed peas, black beans, corn onion, green bell pepper, jalapeno peppers and tomatoes.

Season with Italian style salad dressing and garlic salt, mix well. Cover, refrigerate overnight to blend flavors


