

Gardening Tips

Epsom Salts are good for you to soak your feet in, etc. but did you know it also is effective in controlling or preventing magnesium deficiency in plants.



Magnesium strengthens cell walls and helps plants absorb nitrogen, phosphorus, and sulfur. Sulfur helps plants produce required vitamins, amino acids, and enzymes

Epsom Salts will also correct a problem with too much natural salt in the soil. Too much salt causes the root cells to clog making it hard for the plant to take up water and nutrients. It will also get rid of the accumulation of natural salts in houseplants that have been in the same pot for awhile. It will clear out the accumulation of salt in the pot that can be interfering with the fertilizer uptake into the plant.

Another way of applying Epsom salts to a plant is to dilute it with water and apply as a spray that can be absorbed quickly by the plants. To make this spray combine one tablespoon Epsom Salts with 1 gallon of water. Spraying with Epsom Salt solution weekly will discourage pests too.

For roses: 1 tablespoon per foot of plant height per plant; apply every two weeks. Also scratch 1/2 cup into soil at base to encourage flowering canes and healthy new basal cane growth. Soak unplanted bushes in 1/2 cup of Epsom Salt per gallon of water to help roots recover. Add a tablespoon of Epsom Salt to each hole at planting time.

For palms: apply about ½ pound of Epsom salt per inch of trunk diameter up to about 5 pound per palm. You can apply about 3 tablespoons per square yard in a flower bed and water it in. The Garden Club of St. Petersburg is located at 500 Sunset Drive South, St. Petersburg between Park Street South and the beautiful Boca Ciega Bay. It is just minutes away from Jungle Terrace.

American Cancer Society Walk for Breast Cancer

The people who walked for the American Cancer Society walk spent 2 nights in the park at Walter Fuller Park. The park was a sea of pink tents. Some were decorated and some were not, but the people were all there with the same purpose. To walk for loved ones who had breast cancer.

There were 1,550 walkers and of that number 178 were men. They walked for mothers, sisters, aunts and cousins and for their friends. I talked to several people who were finished early on Saturday. One lady said it was her second 60 mile walk this year. She said she was from Minnesota.

The opening ceremony was held at Ft. Desoto Park at 8:00 a.m. The campers had a mobile city where they could have showers and hot food. They had several pit stops along the way each day. On Sunday, the closing ceremony was held at Spa Beach in downtown St. Pete. This nationwide walk started the first week of August in Chicago and ended in San Diego in November. There were 14 cities in all. The most money raised by an individual was \$21,663. The most money raised by a group was \$163,663. The participants travel an average of 20 miles a day and are provided meals, snacks and liquids. There is also 24 hour medical support.






