One to Remember...

Most of us know him as super dedicated community volunteer Tom Killian. But there is another side to Tom and soon he will take leave to pursue some of his favorite hobbies, including treasure hunting and travel. He is also a talented artist in many mediums.

Tom joined the Jungle Terrace Civic Association in 2000 and has worked at various positions since then, including three years as President from 2003 to 2005.

In 2006 he was named St. Petersburg Citizen of the Month for his work with Neighborhood Associations in St. Petersburg.

A graduate of the 2002 Neighborhood Leadership Program he worked as the 2003 Recruitment Chair and 2004 Planning Chair. Tom also worked as a Group Leader and Speaker on Newsletter development for seven years.

He served as CONA Vice-President in 2006 and Membership Chairman in 2005 and 2006. In 2007 he served on CONA's Executive Board as the Nominating Committee Chair.

The City of St. Petersburg selected him to speak on Umbrella Organizations (CONA) at the

2007 Neighborhood Conference in Sarasota, FL.

Tom currently runs the CONA Mentoring Program, helping associations start newsletters, events and apply for Partnership Grants. He has organized five trips to Tropicana Field for CONA Neighborhoods to see the Ray's play.

But, after Tom serves as a speaker for the Effective Communications module of CONA Leadership in March and then oversees the JTCA Easter Egg Hunt in April he will take his metal detector and go on a quest for treasure and adventure.

He has been trying to ease out of his volunteer commitments for about a

President's Message

The Families of each **St. Pete Police Officer** killed in January received a letter from JTCA expressing our neighborhood's AP-PRECIATION and VALUE of each Officer as Husband, Dad, and Peace Officer.

3rd Annual Parks CleanUP was a huge success. 28 Volunteers. **Tom Killian** led a group on the Pinellas Trail. **Roland Martens** led the group at Abercrombie, and **Dr. Ed Carlson** led the Walter Fuller

Park group. **Jim DeBee, Wes**, and **Patrick** of the City joined in with 2 "Mules" to haul away trash and piles of limbs, and a boat to clean up Jungle Lake.

Mini-CleanUP, Saturday March 26 @ 9am, Walter Fuller Center, to complete our big CleanUP. Please volunteer 2-3 hours. Our Park is looking Fabulous – the Crown Jewel of St. Pete's 150 Parks.

Dr. Ed enjoyed breakfast with Mayor Foster, and asked what we can do for him. We discussed his requests regarding Tyrone Mazda (told him they are good neighbors) and St. Pete Baseball Commission's excellent care of Naimoli Complex. Professional baseball team from Korea is here for 6 weeks. Teams from Canada, Denmark and Australia are coming to play. Italy and Jamaica are eagerly in the talking stages of coming. We discussed the city converting the Sunset Hotel on Central Ave. and Park St. into a dormitory for the baseball teams. The Mayor explored the possibility of lighting one field at Naimoli Complex.

JTCA was represented at a **Codes Hearing**, then wrote a letter to Permits in the Building Dept. and to Stormwater Management in Engineering about not allowing "exceptions" to stormwater management requirements on the Azalea Little League property which contributes to flooding in our area.

Stormwater Drain Project: anticipates crossing Park Street February 21 to March 21. The road signs are up. After connecting Park Street to 28th Avenue, the contractor will go back to finish up on 27th Avenue. Once that is complete, they will be going up 28th Avenue with the construction towards Jungle Lake. Prior to starting on 28th Avenue, the contractor will provide notices to the residents along 28th Avenue.



Finally, there will be an election in November to

While this may seem to be a daunting list of tasks let me assure you that none of them will go without considerable input of the citizens of our city. I believe that your voices and inputs are the key to our city moving forward. I have always stressed that in neighborhood association meetings and





Jungle Terrace Civic Association Minutes of Membership Meeting Monday January 18, 2011

Gopher Tortoises

Gopher Tortoises are part of JTCA's Tampa Bay Estuary Program Grant. This response to our inquiry educates all of us to our "legal" relationship with Gopher Tortoises.



"I really appreciate folks taking time to consider species and how activities – no matter how good the intention – may affect them. Always feel free to contact us with questions regarding **any** species or environmental topics. Regarding your inquiry about the tortoises on roads or in the Brush Site, I have an answer. I do not recommend moving the tortoises for two reasons (there are more, but not necessary to mention here).

First, it is illegal to move tortoises. Second, tortoises are highly mobile, and research shows they commonly move long distances to forage, seek mates, or move to another tortoise. So, should you move one, it may just come right back if it wants.

With these two items in mind, I'll explain a couple of special cases. First, if there is a tortoise right in the middle of the road, I would probably risk moving it to the side of the road that it was moving towards. Second, the brush site is a little tricky because I have observed many tortoise burrows in areas where there is a substantial amount of cut or fallen shrubs, brush, and trees. Sometimes I have observed them taking advantage of the warmth of mulch piles by digging burrows underneath them. So, without knowing the operations of the brush site, I would recommend just letting them be. If it is possible to educate folks that use or are employees of the brush site, then that might be the ideal option.

Pinellas County is nearly completely developed. The tortoises seen now are small remnants of what was a large, widely distributed population forced onto ever smaller and smaller pieces of marginal habitat. This is the main reason Tortoises can

be so evident – they nearly always have to cross roads or live in grassy parks to survive. Thanks again for your question. I've copied a section from the FWC website FAQs below to show you how they handled a similar topic. Feel free to contact us if you need anything more." It is illegal to possess or relocate a tortoise without a permit from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Although a wildlife officer would not write you a citation for helping a tortoise across a busy road, picking up a tortoise and taking it to a new location is a violation law. If you do see a tortoise in the road and help it across, be sure to move it across the road in the direction it was heading as the tortoise has a burrow (home) nearby and needs that home to survive. Also remember, moving it (especially during cold weather) could stress or even kill it. Moving tortoises can also spread disease to other tortoise populations. These animals have a strong instinct to return to their original burrow and, if relocated down the road, will likely return to where you first found them.
