I don't know if any of the JT folks like to play cards, but there is a lovely card club very close to all the JT folks who might be interested.



Unstuffed Peppers

Serves 6, Prep Time 5 Minutes 1 # Ground Beef



2 Large Peppers (cut up)

1 1/4 cups Water

1 cup Instant Rice

In 12 inch non-stick skillet, brown ground beef. Drain. Stir in remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil over high heat. Reduce heat to medium-low and cook covered 20 minutes or until liquid is absorbed and rice is tender

Gardening Tips

Azalea

Keep these plants well watered. The buds will be growing during the cool weather and if water is not supplied, they may abort or be very small for flowering in the spring.



Camellias

Tea scale may have reinfested some of your plants. Use cygon for best results (ALWAYS FOLLOW LABEL DIRECTIONS). Early varieties will certainly have a few flowers now. Water the plants at least once a week by thoroughly soaking the soil.

Christmas cactus



This holiday season plant should have a lot of buds by the end of the month. Don't over water. Do not fertilize. Growing the plant a little on the dry side will help to prevent root fungus. Should the plant show signs of collapsing, the leaves, (so called) will limp and detach from the main stem. This is the first sign of a root rot. It can

be controlled, even prevented, by drenching the soil and roots with a good fungicide.

Easter Lilies

If you didn't get your bulbs in the ground earlier, then do it immediately. Let me suggest you add about two cups of cow manure in the planting hole. Plant the bulbs at least four to six inches deep. Mulch to help conserve moisture. Water on a daily basis. Once the leaves have emerged, fertilize with a soluble fertilizer at least two or three times a week.

Plugs for St. Augustine

Frequently, the question is asked about when to plant because this is an easy method of establishing a new lawn. Honestly, plugs can be planted any time of the year. Fall is a very good time. The soil is warmer than the air. As a result, the roots will grow and become established and the plug will be ready to produce new growth in the form of runners in the spring. Consider plugging your existing St. Augustine lawn where areas are thinned due to insects and drought or converting your worm out Bahia lawn to St. Augustine.

Poinsettia

The hornworms are out in great force!!! Check all outside plants on a daily basis. This worm is very hard to see so, look closely at the plant. Use thuricide for best control. If the plant has yellow color, then add magnesium sulfate (epsom salts), using about a cup or two to a large plant. Add a small amount of good fertilizer at the same time.

Roses

Although a fine plant for flowers, they must have constant attention. It is necessary to maintain a weekly spray program. Use a good fungicide for control of black spot and mildew. Don't forget to fertilize every month to six weeks. Insects will be at a minimum, during cool weather. Nevertheless, a few such as aphids or even an occasional worm or spider mite may land on the plant. Water plants at least every other day, soaking the soil thoroughly.





½ cup White Raisins (floured with ½ cup)

Fred Marquis Pinellas Trail **Receives National Recognition**

Like a living legend making its grandest stage, the Fred Marquis Pinellas Trail was formally inducted into the Rail-Trail Hall of Fame on Tuesday, Oct. 21, at the 2008



ProBike®/ProWalk Florida Conference held at the Hilton St. Petersburg Bayfront hotel.

Since opening the first five-mile stretch in December 1990, Pinellas County's urban Pinellas Trail has helped millions of Floridians and visitors gain access to healthier and more sustainable lifestyles.

Today in Florida's second-smallest yet most densely populated county, the trail and its spurs span 50 miles among nine cities and towns throughout Pinellas County. It is recognized as one of the best U.S. trail systems and will become one of the first five

Thanksgiving Sausage Dressing



1 lb. sausage (i.e. Jimmy Dean), separate to small pieces 2 medium onions - diced

3 stalks of celery - diced

3 eggs Salt and pepper to taste 1/4 to 1/2 cup of milk

2 1/2 to 3 loaves of bread

Stir together sausage, onions, celery, eggs, salt & pepper in LARGE bowl. Toast and cut bread in small pieces. Add small amount of toasted bread. Stir to moisten. Continue to add toast and mix well. Add 1/4 to 1/2 cup of milk to moisten. Form small patties on baking pan. Bake at 350° for 30 to 45 minutes until sausage is cooked.

trails to be nationally recognized by the hallowed institution of trails, Rails-to-Trails Conservancy (RTC). It is these trails – converted from unused railroad lines - that the nation connects in the same way the railroads once linked people across the county. Across the U.S., more than 15,000 miles of rail-trails create the pathways linking metropolitan areas with small towns and everywhere in between.

Each month, approximately 90,000 individuals use the Pinellas Trail, a unique greenway corridor linking some of the county's most picturesque parks, scenic coastal areas and residential neighborhoods. While traveling along the trail, outdoor enthusiasts enjoy deep glades of ancient live oaks trailing Spanish moss, quiet waterways and tidal streams with all varieties of land and water birds.

Amenities, such as benches, water fountains, rest areas and landscaping, are paid for by the citizens fundraising group Pinellas Trails, Inc. Hailed as a priceless haven in a busy, highly urbanized environment, it provides trail-goers both recreation and alternative commuter transportation options. More than 10 over- and underpasses allow users to travel breezily above or below busy intersection traffic.

RTC's Rail-Trail Hall of Fame was established in 2007 to honor outstanding rail-trails. Currently 1,500 open rail-trails exist and approximately 750 more are in development. Hall of Fame inductees are selected based on merits such as scenic value, high use, trail and trailside amenities, historical significance, excellence in management and maintenance of facility, community connections and geographic distribution.

Past trails that have received the designation include the Minuteman Bikeway in Boston, the Burke -Gilman Trail in Seattle, the Katy Trail State Park in Missouri and the Great Allegheny Passage in Maryland and Pennsylvania.






