Parking Codes for St. Petersburg



WHERE TO PARK

There are city codes that govern where you can park in a residential district. Depending on the orientation of your lot, other rules may apply, but in general;

- Passenger vehicles and motorcycles can be parked in the front of the house or in the street side yard provided they are located on an approved, legally recognized parking area or driveway. Legally recognized parking areas and, driveways are approved by the Development Review Services Department of the City. The construction, location and size of the parking area must be reviewed. Call 893-7471 for more information.
- Parking is never allowed on the right-of-way (R.O.W.) area between the paved street and the private property line unless the vehicle is parked on a driveway apron that has been installed with the required permit and the vehicle does not block the sidewalk.

Parking codes...cont'd

- Your Community Police Officer will be notified of any and all R.O.W. parking and you could receive an illegal parking ticket. Both recreational vehicles and boats are considered domestic equipment and up to (2) two pieces of domestic equipment may be parked on certain areas of a residential lot. To be considered domestic equipment (which includes motor homes, trailers and utility trailers), the items cannot be designed or intended to be used for commercial purposes. Commercial equipment cannot be parked in residential districts except within completely enclosed and legally permitted structure.
 - a. Parking or storage of domestic equipment is not permitted in a front yard, on a corner lot, within a street side yard or in a waterfront yard.
- You may legally park domestic equipment in the rear or interior side yard of a lot. Up to (2) two pieces of domestic equipment may be parked in the front and/or street side yard, for weekend use, between the hours of 4:00 PM Thursday and 8:00 AM Monday, only.
 - a. Each piece of domestic equipment may be up to 35 feet long, up to 8 feet wide and up to 12 feet high. Anything larger is not allowed.
- The parking codes were designed for several reasons;
 - a. When cars are improperly parked, grass and plants are unable to grow. Soil erosion begins to wash into the storm water drainage system and impairs their effectiveness.
 - b. Improperly parked vehicles and domestic equipment can cause visibility and safety problems for motorists on streets and driveways.
 - c. Well maintained parking areas make the entire neighborhood look better which has a positive effect on property values in the neighborhood.
 - d. Underground utilities, curbs, and sidewalks are often damaged by the weight of the vehicles parking and driving over them.

The Codes Compliance Assistance Department office has free brochures titled "Where to Park" and "Parking Commercial Equipment". The complaint line phone number for reporting a violation is 727-893-7373.

President's Message

NEW Storm Drains are ready to cross 80th St. into WFP. The lake will be 3.5 inches higher. A “weir” controls water exit to the bay. A weir slot allows the lake to lower slowly in small rains for better water quality processes to take place before going to the bay. Large rains overflow the top of the weir to prevent flooding surrounding streets. A “skimmer” plate is mounted in front of the weir to hold back floating vegetation, trash, debris, floating oils, to keep them from discharging to the bay. A large gap between the plate and the weir allows water to freely flow under the plate and out through the weir. Maintenance around the outfall removes the debris that accumulates.

Susan Fuchs, our Public Service Rep, visited our area with me to review areas in need of various attention: potholes, sign issues, graffiti, utility box issues, trees over road or obscuring signs, etc. that need attention. (This is NOT Codes)

Misty Cladas, TBEP, visited Walter Fuller Park, Pinellas Trail, and Abercrombie Park to see our great results from their grant. She was highly pleased with all 3 parks! **Eileen Dardis**, JTCA Secretary is applying for a TBEP Grant to finish the Pinellas Trail trimming, removal of invasive plants on the fingers of Jungle Lake and plant native plants for food for wildlife in conjunction with Florida Native Plant Society.

Orange tape around WFP trees caused major excitement they were marked for removal. I met on site with City Arborists Mike Vineyard and William Olive. This is a “municipal tree inventory program”, to evaluate the health, environment and economic benefits of the current urban forest in parks and along right-of-ways.

Tennis Courts received new fencing, and a new backboard. Yes, the fence is black when all other fence in the park is green. This has been made know to Parks Dept. and they will call us before park projects and use green fence in WFP per previous agreements.

Parks Director **Phil Whitehouse** met with me in WFP to review 7 areas, including a small entrance garden from 30th Avenue, the only unsightly entry to the park. We met with engineer **Dan Saunders** regarding the Storm Drain Project for 30th Avenue coming next year; with **Soccer** about adding a light for security; **Joe Kubicki**, Transportation and **Cheryl Stacks**, bicycle director about Bike Path (see story). JTCA’s appreciation was expressed to Phil for having the 5 Batter’s Eyes painted dark green on both sides.

JTCA has applied for a City ART Grant (see story, page 4), and a Police Forfeiture Grant.

Art Grant for Walter Fuller Park

Through a national and local call to artists, and considering the responses, the Art Committee of JTCA chose a West St. Pete architect and sculptor, Robbie Robbins (www.RobbieRobbins.com) who is nationally renowned. The Stainless Steel sculpture was named "Entwined" to "announce our neighborhood, be dramatic, interactive, and durable."

The Neighborhood Partnership Art Grant for Walter Fuller Park continues to move forward with Secretary Eileen Dardis, and Board Members Yaro Markewycz and Dr. Roland Marten each individually attending City meetings on the Grant process.

Parks Department approved the location and the Public Service Rep has initialed that our other grants are fully maintained. Letters of support came from West Neighborhoods United (WENU) and The Real Environmental Preserve Our Parks (REPOP).

BIKE PATH-Pinellas Trail to Walter Fuller Park

A Bike Path is 12 feet wide, concrete, with decorative street lights along the path. (Rather than painted lines on the street surface.)

Dr. Ed Carlson met in Walter Fuller Park with Joe Kubicki, Transportation Director, Cheryl Stacks, Bicycle Director, and Phil Whitehouse, Parks Director. A grant is available to create a Bike Path connection from the Pinellas Trail to Walter Fuller Park – to WF Center and Swim Pool. After discussion to keep the path away from residences, beginning at 22nd Ave. N. was chosen as the start point.

The path will come along 22nd Ave. No. on the north right-of-way, cross 72nd at the traffic light, turn north along west right-of-way of 72nd St to 26th Ave, then along 26th Ave. to the Park. (Solid Line)

First proposal was through commercial property on south side of 26th Ave, crossing 75th St, to the park sidewalk. (Dotted line) There are lots of utilities, trees, and maintenance is not dependable by commercial properties unless leased or owned. The park sidewalk is 4 feet wide – widening to 12 feet creates a distortion of esthetics, mixes bicycles with pedestrians enjoying park, and must cross 75th Street.

JTCA Board of Directors favors this 26th Ave location and lighting plan:

The South side of 26th Avenue

1. Few Utilities
2. Wastewater Treatment and Brush Site are maintained by WFP Staff.
3. Enhanced appearance of south side of 26th with landscaping and decorative lights.
4. Additional lighting on 26th Ave creates safer area, especially for Soccer children.
5. Azalea Middle School property is final segment, giving students direct access to Bike Path on School Property, crossing NO streets.
6. Do not cross 75th Street or 26th Avenue.
7. No mix of bicycles with pedestrians walking around WF. (our biggest complaint) Cyclists go directly to Swim Pool or WF Center when cross 26th Ave.

8. Does not distort the visual esthetics of an even border of sidewalk around WF Park.

9. LIGHTING: Use 3,000K bulbs (more yellowish) to be congruent and in harmony with lights we now have IN and AROUND the park. (Rather than the garish white toward 6,500K.)

JTCA is also eager to develop a connection from the Trail to Tyrone Mall across from Pennys.

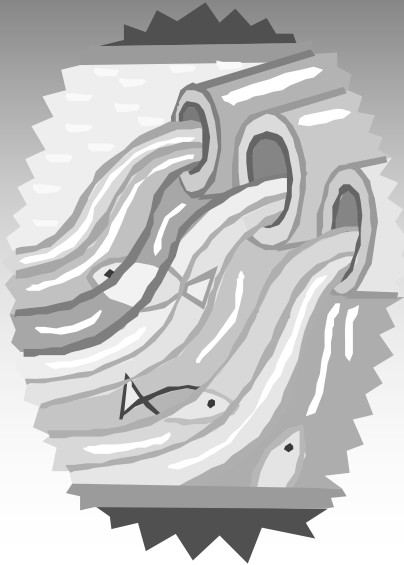


Community Library

Joint Actions: Neighborhood cleanups and the Pinellas Trail, having accomplished Yellow "Trail Patrol" t-shirts to 105 members, Yellow "Trail Markings" every 200 feet with GPS location for Police, Fire, Rescue (thank you Herb Polson!), and \$3,200 grant money to remove 90 trees and trim 25 trees along the Tyrone Mall stretch of the trail. Tyrone Industrial Park adds \$1 Billion to Economy

The Tyrone Industrial Park area is often under-appreciated as a major engine of St. Petersburg's economy. For decades, the more than 130 acres of industrially zoned land behind the Tyrone Mall has consistently provided high-skill, high-waged jobs for city residents.

Nearly 30 businesses employing more than 2,500 persons call the Tyrone Industrial Park home. They include a variety of light manufacturing operations producing items ranging from medical devices, to electrical and electronic components, to communications systems for the military.

Some of these employers include:

Raytheon, the largest employer in the Tyrone Industrial Park, specializes in radio wave technologies, switching systems, and hardware & software applications for the United States military.

Conax Corporation is a leader in electro-explosive technology, including electro-explosive mechanical release systems and stored energy release devices. Their automatically inflated life vests and automatic parachute releases are used by all U.S. Air Force and Navy ejection seat pilots, as well as NASA astronauts.

Bovie Aaron Medical manufactures office-based electrosurgical generators and accessories for the medical industry. They are the number one producer of battery-operated cauteries in the world.

Cavaform International manufactures injection molds and components primarily for the medical and personal care markets. Products include syringes, catheter tooling, pipettes, medical shields, centrifuge tubes and vials, and cosmetic containers.

Precise Technology is a full-service injection molder of precision plastic components and assemblies, serving the personal care, healthcare, and food & beverage industries.

Sensor Systems, L.L.C., supplies precision electro-mechanical components including Feedback Potentiometers, semi-Precision Feedback/Panel Potentiometers and Potentiometric Pressure Transducers, and Strain Gauge-based Pressure Transducers.

These and other manufacturing companies create high-wage jobs and their value-added manufacturing processes create large economic impacts. The high-wage jobs create more disposable income for employee expenditures, helping to attract additional community amenities. The value-added processes of manufacturers produce a multiplier effect due to purchases from other industries, and because they sell products outside the Tampa Bay market, they bring new dollars into the community.

St. Petersburg's Economic Development Department recently requested that the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council conduct an analysis of the potential economic impact due to a change in land use at the Tyrone Industrial Park. Using the nationally recognized Regional Economic Models Inc. (REMI) Policy Insight model, the total impact of effectively removing the 2,580 Tyrone employees from the Pinellas economy was measured.

The results indicate that the loss of 2,580 direct manufacturing jobs would result in a loss of an additional 5,670 full-time jobs for a total job reduction of 8,250 full time equivalent positions. This would impact our economy through the loss of some \$280 million in wages and \$950 million in gross county product. This \$1 billion impact dwarfs a similarly sized retail project, which would cause a \$42 million impact.

An aggressive residential redevelopment atmosphere, renewed interest by national retailers, rising commercial property values, and the lower perceived relative value of industrial land all contribute to a continuing interest in rezoning industrial land. However, a closer look at the Tyrone Industrial Park and its \$1 billion annual impact should cause more appreciation for the economic contributions and the overall importance of industrial areas, and the need to retain them.

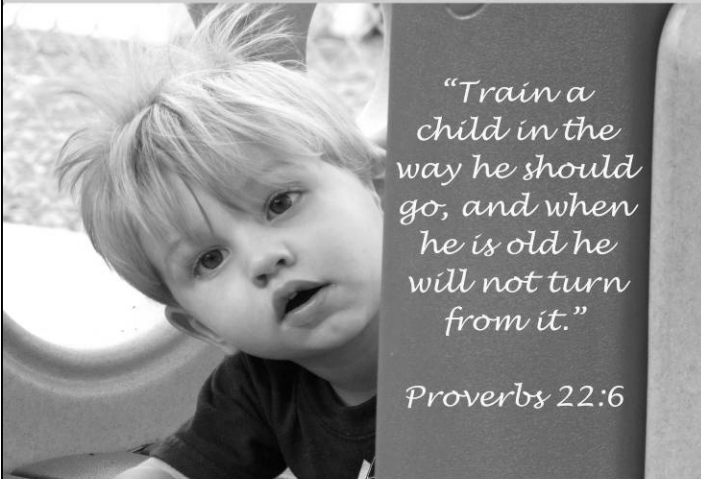

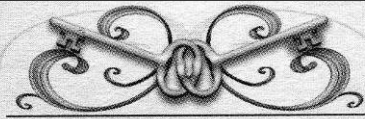
