Jungle Terrace Civic Association is applying for an Art Grant through the City of St. Petersburg's Neighborhood Partnership Grant Program. The location selected for the Art is 22nd Avenue North at 79th Street – directly across from the City Gardens, and in front of the Azalea Middle School. It is diagonal from a church, and across from the first residence in JTCA. 9,000 cars pass this location each day.

Three Neighborhood Associations join at this corner: Jungle Terrace to the north; Azalea to the south and east of 79th Street; Jungle Prada south and west of 79th St. All three neighborhoods will benefit from and enjoy this Art.

JTCA is very large, with 3,000 homes, 2 large parks, Walter Fuller Civic Center, Devil Rays spring training facility, dog park, swimming pool, Tyrone Square Mall, Tyrone Industrial Park; Pinellas Trail; Science Center; and many, many businesses.

The Art should announce our neighborhood. We are looking for Art that is dramatic, interactive, and durable. We seek Art to take advantage of both the location and our neighborhood history. To accomplish these, and extend the enjoyment after dark, we want our Art to be lighted so it can be seen at night. Possibly lighting can be installed inside the Art. The Art must be made of materials that will last a long time, with low upkeep.
