

Enjoy Remote Control Aircraft in Walter Fuller Park every morning at sunrise – fly them or watch them. (See story, page 12.)



REPAVING: 2 blocks of 34th Ave and 35 Ave repaved thanks to Board Member Roland Marten and our PSR Susan Fuchs!

For over 10 days, there are two abandoned TIMES boxes in street. PSR Debbie Larson had these removed.

PARKING ISSUE over 4 months: CSO Detty stopped by Cobham and had “the talk” with them. Not a single person parking on grass now! Even the Codes violation did not solve the problem. Thank you Officer Mitch.

74th St Elementary School: Dr. Ed met Michael Frederick on report by Principal to evaluate parents speeding leaving school drop off without stopping as enter 72nd Street N.

Storm Drain is crossing 80th Street. Progress through the park will be faster with no road and curbing to tear up, haul away, and replace.

Mayor's Report: “In the next year,

two more master storm drain projects are planned: the Jungle Lake N.E. Basin Drainage Improvements (30th Ave. N. from 78th to 75th Streets). . . YEA!

Blinking lights at 6:30 a.m. in WFP as 9 men laid sod to complete restoration and rehabilitation of highly eroded areas. Rubble was placed to stabilize, then topsoil, then 2" of mulch, then sod carefully and tightly laid on the re-established curve. Thank you Jim DeBee for organizing this, and thanks to Wes, Patrick, Sonny, Earl and others for an artful and caring installation. The restored areas extend from both sides of the South Shelter, the West Shelter and Drain, the Storm Drain by old BMX area, and 30th Ave North entrance to park and 100 feet of bank that eroded dirt onto sidewalk and into street. This is a MAJOR improvement to our park!

From 28 years ago I remember the rusty fence, overgrown 15' high, sandspur fields where soccer is now, snakes and rats, and PARC abandoned nursery. I took photos and got neighbors to sign a petition for the City to clean up. Since then the gradual changes in the Park have been major over a quarter of a century.


Community Library News

Free Workshop Teaches Historic Home Owners Valuable Restoration Skills

St. Petersburg, Florida (October 12, 2011) – When you think of historic buildings at risk, visions of heritage train stations, courthouses and other culturally significant buildings come to mind. And sadly, every day these magnificent structures do face the wrecking ball. But, on a smaller, but no less important scale, is the loss of pieces of history, due to the lack of knowledge of their value and the lack of skill for their care. Wood windows, original flooring and built-in bookcases are demolished every day, destroying architectural character and reducing home values.

Patterned after Lakeland's 10-year successful string of events, Historic Home Workshops provide the knowledge and skills to save these historic materials. The City of St. Petersburg, Planning and Economic Development Department, Urban Planning and Historic Preservation Division is producing its own Historic Homes Workshop on November 19, 2011 at the Shuffleboard Club, 599 Mirror Lake Dr. from noon-6 pm. It will feature displays and demonstrations of the trades and skills most often required to restore and maintain a historic home.

"Historic homeowners often wish to take a hands-on approach to restoring their houses. This workshop will sharpen some of the skills required," observes Kim Hinder, Historic Preservationist. "The homeowner who wishes to hire professionals will come away more educated on what is available and how to best utilize restoration experts."

You might wonder, "What is considered to be historic? My house was built in 1956." Well, your house is historic because it's over 50 years old. The architecture of your house is a lesson in the culture of its time. After World War Two, when the suburban boom gained momentum, they were designed to look to the future – not to the past – for their inspiration.

The event is co-sponsored by Saint Petersburg Preservation



(SPP), a non-profit seeking to retain St. Petersburg's unique sense of place by advocating for the protection of the best of the city's historic buildings and resources. SPP president Peter Belmont observed, "The workshop promises to be informative and fun, offering tips to anyone interested in improving their property whether they are presently an historic homeowner or not." SPP offers Saturday morning historic walking tours to educate the public on our unique history and our variety of architecture from October to April.

In addition to the building trades, information valuable to old house owners will be presented. Michael Manlowe from Twigs & Leaves will advise on Florida friendly native landscaping.

Steve Quillian of Wood Window Makeover will demonstrate how to repair your wood windows. Pointers on giving an old floor new life will be given by Dennis Prieur of Through the Woods. Jo-Ann Peck of Historic Shed will help you decide on

Red Light Cameras - Beware

St. Pete launched "Stop on Red" with Red Light Cameras at 12 intersections.

The intersections were chosen after evaluating red-light running crashes in the city. Cameras capture still images and video of red-light running violations.

The last three years, St. Pete experienced 21 fatal crashes at signalized intersections, with 13 fatalities attributed to red-light running.

A recent analysis of crashes showed

20 percent of collisions are directly attributed to red-light running. In 2009, 113,000 people were injured and 676 were killed in red-light crashes. 62 Floridians were killed making Florida the third most deadly state for red-light crashes.

St. Pete joins 70 communities in Florida and 500 nationally using the technology to create safer driving habits.

Florida Goes After Gun Outlaws

Florida goes after gun outlaws with \$5,000 fines, firings and lawsuits.

So who's in the gang? St. Petersburg, Brooksville, Tampa, Hillsborough County - and other scattered scofflaws.

City councils and county commissions are scrambling to rewrite local laws, because they're staring down the barrel at fines, firings and lawsuits.

St. Pete will repeal its ordinance against discharging firearms in city limits. Tarpon Springs made a similar decision in August. Brooksville killed a ban on guns in parks and deleted a law that suspended sale of ammunition and

firearms during emergencies. There are many more.

All these ordinances have been illegal for years because state law prevents cities and counties from regulating guns. But a new law, set to take effect Oct. 1, takes it a step further. The new law allows judgments up to \$100,000 against local governments. The law says local officials can be fired and fined \$5,000, with no representation from city or county attorney.

Kraig Conn, legislative counsel for the Florida League of Cities, said "City officials reacted with "a level of disbelief" as they realized their governments could be penalized and "you're going to be held personally liable as well."

State Rep. Matt Gaetz, R-Fort Walton Beach, who sponsored the law, said "There's been plenty of hand-wringing and bed-wetting from local government." But he said something needed to be done to prevent them from "willfully" violating state law. He pointed to South Miami's ordinance requiring trigger locks. The National Rifle Association fought the law, and it was overturned because of the state law preventing it. Even so, Gaetz said, "There was no way for the NRA to ever be made whole through the recovery of attorney's fees and everything else."

Asked if it wouldn't be helpful to keep guns out of city parks, Gaetz said it's never the law-abiding people with proper concealed weapons permits who cause trouble. It's always the people who illegally have guns.



All flyers abide by the City Ordinances for Remote Controlled Craft (including boats), and carry \$1 Million in liability insurance. These pilots are a safe and fun group. Come by some morning, sit in the grandstand, and enjoy the Aerial Show!




